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Dear Judge Haden:

In a Letter of Map Revision (LOMR) date August 7, 2023, you were notified of proposed flood hazard determinations affecting the Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) and Flood Insurance Study (FIS) report for Caldwell County, TX. These determinations were for Seals Creek - from approximately 790 feet upstream of Bugtussle Lane to approximately 340 feet upstream of Acorn Road; Seals Creek Tributary A - from the confluence with Seals Creek to approximately 1,970 feet downstream of U.S. 20; Seals Creek Tributary A2 - from the confluence with Seals Creek Tributary A to approximately 1,450 feet upstream of the confluence with Seals Creek Tributary A; and Seals Creek Tributary B - from the confluence with Seals Creek to the upstream side of Acorn Road. The 90-day appeal period that was initiated on August 24, 2023 when the Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) published a notice of proposed Flood Hazard Determinations in *The Lockhart Post-Register* has elapsed.

FEMA received no valid requests for changes to the modified flood hazard information. Therefore, the modified flood hazard information for your community that became effective on December 22, 2023, remains valid and revises the FIRM and FIS report that were in effect prior to that date.


The modifications are pursuant to Section 206 of the Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973 (Public Law 93-234) and are in accordance with the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, as amended (Title XIII of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, Public Law 90-448), 42 U.S.C. 4001-4128, and 44 CFR Part 65. The community number(s) and suffix code(s) are unaffected by this revision. The community number and appropriate suffix code as shown above will be used by the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) for all flood insurance policies and renewals issued for your community.

FEMA has developed criteria for floodplain management as required under the above-mentioned Acts of 1968 and 1973. To continue participation in the NFIP, your community must use the modified flood hazard information to carry out the floodplain management regulations for the NFIP.
