Arias & Associates, Inc. appreciates the opportunity to submit our proposal for testing services on the referenced project. The attachment presents our Estimate for providing CMT quality control services, as requested during the project by your representatives. We rely on your representatives to contact our dispatcher when our services are desired. Therefore, the quantity and frequency of testing is the responsibility of our customer.

Quality control or assurance tests serve to indicate the material quality for the specific material tested at a specific location at a particular time and date. Quality control or assurance tests do not represent the quality of any other portion of material placed, other than the portion tested and cannot in any way guarantee the quality of a final work product.

We understand that the project development will consist of the renovation of a existing building located at 1703 S. Colorado St, Lockhart, Texas. A line item description of our on call services that are included in the total cost estimate of this proposal are mentioned below:

- Sample subgrade and fill material to be tested in our laboratory for reporting of test results.
- Perform density compaction testing on the subgrade and fill material placed in the proposed structure areas.
- Reinforcing steel observation and reporting.
- Drilled pier observation with associated concrete sampling and testing.
 - * It is assumed that drilled pier operations will be completed in approximately three (3) days.
- Sampling structural concrete during placement. The cylinders will be transported to our laboratory, stored, cured, and tested for compressive strength on the specified dates.
- Structural steel observation performed by a licensed CWI. Costs associated with access to welds/framing have not been included in our proposed fees.
- Professional service fees for project management, data processing and reporting.

We have prepared an estimate for our on call scope of services based on information and our interpretations of the plans and specifications provided to us by Mr. Mack Ellis with Braun & Butler Construction. A construction schedule was not available at the time this proposal was generated. Should Arias & Associates, Inc. be awarded this project we request that a full set of plans and specifications and all addendums prior to the project start date be provided to us. Efforts will be made to maintain the testing cost within our Estimate but we recognize that variations in construction schedules could result in differences between the actual and estimated testing cost; and that our Estimate may change depending on the means and methods utilized by the contractor. Requests for any required change orders will be made as soon as possible during the construction of the project. Services authorized by the client or their designated representative in excess of the Estimated quantities will be charged based on our appropriate unit rates. Based on this information, we estimate our services will cost approximately \$ 7,803.80 as itemized on the attached Estimate. Also, please note that we will only invoice for the actual services and required laboratory services.

We propose that we conduct this work on a unit fee basis in accordance with the attached General Conditions. - Insurance: Vendor must maintain commercial general liability insurance coverage, including contractual liability insurance coverage, in the amount of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) per occurrence, with a general aggregate of one million dollars (\$1,000,000), for the duration of the Contract.
 - a. Before performing under the Contract, Vendor must deliver a certificate of insurance acceptable to the County. Vendor agrees that if it performs under the Contract without providing such a certificate, the County will withhold any payments under the Contract until Vendor delivers the certificate.
 - b. Vendor must endorse the policy or policies providing commercial general liability, as required above, to name the County, its officials, department heads, employees, and assigns as additional insured with respect to operations performed by or for the Vendor in performance of the Contract. Such policy must contain an endorsement that the "other insurance" clause will not apply to the County, its officials, department heads, employees, and assigns.
 - c. Vendor must require any subcontractor performing under the Contract to carry insurance of the types and within limits of liability as the County deems appropriate and adequate. If a subcontractor is unable to furnish insurance required under the Contract, Vendor must endorse the subcontractor as an additional insured and deliver a certificate of insurance evidencing the subcontractor's insurance coverage.
- 5. Workers compensation: Vendor must provide and maintain for the duration of the Contract workers' compensation insurance in compliance with the Texas Workers Compensation Act, Title 5, Subtitle A, Texas Labor Code, for all its employees assigned to perform under the Contract. In the event Vendor elects to subcontract any services, Vendor must require each subcontractor to provide workers' compensation insurance for all its employees unless such employees are afforded protection by Vendor.
- 6. Indemnification: Vendor must, indemnify, and hold harmless the County, its officers, and its employees from and against all claims, actions, suits, demands, proceedings, costs, damages, and liabilities, including without limitation attorney fees and court costs, to the extent arising out of, connected with, or resulting from any acts or

- omissions of the Vendor or any official, agent, employee, subcontractor, or supplier of the Vendor in the execution or performance of the Contract.
- 7. Alteration, Amendment or Modification: The Contract may not be altered, amended, or modified except in writing signed by each party to the Contract. No official, agent, employee, or representative of either party has the authority to alter, amend, or modify the terms of the Contract, except in accordance with express written authority as may be respectively granted by the County or the Vendor.
- Assignment: Vendor may not assign, in whole or in part, any interest it may have in the Contract without the prior written consent of the County.
- Severability: If any provision of the Contract is found to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability will not affect the remaining provisions of the Contract.
- 10. Breach: The failure of either party to comply with the terms and conditions of the Contract will constitute a breach of this Contract. Either party will be entitled to any and all rights and remedies allowed under Texas law for any breach of the Contract by the other party.
- 11. Non-Waiver: The waiver by either party of a breach of the Contract will not constitute a continuing waiver of such breach or of a subsequent breach of the same or a different provision. Nothing in the Contract is intended by either party to constitute a waiver of any immunity from suit or liability to which it is entitled under applicable law.
- Non-Defined Terms: If not specifically defined in the Contract, words and phrases used in the Contract will have their ordinary meaning as defined by common usage.
- Controlling Provisions: In the event of any conflict between provisions in the attached agreement and provisions in this addendum, provisions in this addendum will control.
- Third Parties: The Contract is not intended to confer any rights on any third party, and it will not be construed as conferring any rights on any third party.
- 15. Entire Contract: The attached agreement and this addendum constitute the entire Contract between the County and Vendor. No other agreement, statement, or promise relating to the subject matter of the Contract which is not contained in the Contract or incorporated by reference in the Contract will be valid or binding.
- 16. Limitation of Liability: THE TOTAL CUMULATIVE LIABILITY OF VENDOR, ITS SUBCONSULTANTS AND SUBCONTRACTORS, AND ALL OF THEIR RESPECTIVE DIRECTORS, OFFICERS, SHAREHOLDERS, EMPLOYEES AND AGENTS (COLLECTIVELY "VENDOR ENTITIES") TO COUNTY ARISING FROM SERVICES THIS AGREEMENT, INCLUDING ANY REIMBURSEMENT OF ATTORNEY'S FEES AND/OR INDEMNITY OBLIGATION UNDER THIS AGREEMENT, WILL NOT EXCEED THE GROSS COMPENSATION RECEIVED BY VENDOR UNDER THIS AGREEMENT OR \$1,000,000, WHICHEVER IS GREATER. LIMITATION APPLIES TO ALL LAWSUITS, CLAIMS OR ACTIONS THAT ALLEGE ERRORS OR OMISSIONS IN

- VENDER SERVICES, WHETHER ALLEGED TO ARISE IN TORT, CONTRACT, WARRANTY OR OTHER LEGAL THEORY.
- Standard of Care: In providing services under this Contract, Vendor will endeavor to perform in a manner consistent with that degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the same profession currently practicing under similar circumstances. Upon notice to Vendor and by mutual agreement between the parties, Vendor will without additional compensation, correct those services not meeting this standard. Vendor makes no warranty, express or implied, as to its professional services rendered under this Contract.

Arias & Associates, Inc. appreciates the opportunity to submit our proposal for geotechnical engineering services on the referenced project. We understand that the project consists of the renovation of an existing building located at 1703 S. Colorado St, Lockhart, Texas. The existing building is founded on underreamed piers. Exterior CMU walls are supported by grade beams. The slab is ground-supported, with a select fill pad of about 3' thickness. Proposed renovations include construction of new entrance, with approximate dimensions of 40' x 40', founded on underreamed piers.

As requested, we are proposing to provide geotechnical services to identify a suitable bearing strata and recommend drilled pier bearing capacities.

Proposed Scope of Services

Our geotechnical services will include one soil borings to a depth of 30'.

- 1. We propose to perform one (1) boring positioned outside of the building, drilled to an approximate maximum 30 foot. The location will be in an area accessible to a truck-mounted drilling rig. Arias will retain a subcontract driller to perform drilling; however, Arias personnel will direct the sampling efforts, and will visually classify recovered samples. Soils will be sampled by either pushing a thin-walled tube (ASTM D 1587), by a split barrel sampler while performing the Standard Penetration Test (ASTM D 1586), or by auger. Samples in bedrock where SPT samples cannot be obtained will be taken from the auger cuttings. Rock coring is not included in our service scope. Recovered soils/rock will be visually classified in the field.
- 2. If groundwater is encountered, the groundwater levels within the open borehole will be recorded at the time of drilling and immediately following drilling. The boreholes will be backfilled with cuttings generated by drilling operations after completion of drilling.
- 3. Laboratory testing will be performed on recovered samples selected by the geotechnical engineer to aid in soil classification and to measure engineering properties. Laboratory testing is expected to include moisture content, Atterberg limits, fines content, unconfined compression strength, and pressure-swell. The actual laboratory program will depend upon the type of soils encountered.
- 4. We will issue both an electronic and hard copy of our formal engineering report prepared by a licensed professional engineer in Texas that will include:
 - Description of the field exploration program;

- Description of the laboratory testing program;
- Soil boring plan that depicts the borehole on a base map provided by Client;
- Soil boring log with soil classifications based on the Unified Soil Classification System (ASTM D 2487);
- Description of site geology based on location of the site on the Geologic Atlas of Texas;
- Generalized site stratigraphy and engineering properties developed from field and laboratory data at the explored locations;
- Depth where groundwater was encountered during drilling and its potential impact;
- · Recommendations for building pad construction;
- Recommendations for drilled pier design and construction, including bearing strata and bearing capacity.

Proposed Fee

We propose that the fee for the performance of the scope of work for this project as described in this proposal be \$3,000.00 and that the work will be performed as outlined in the General Conditions included with this proposal. Upon authorization a partial invoice will be issued in the amount of \$1,600.00 to initiate site mobilization of geotechnical field testing equipment and personnel.

We have prepared our scope and fee with the understanding that no clearing will be required, no concrete coring will be required, and that no special permission will be needed for access. We have assumed that you will provide free access to the site. Meetings after report submission and supplemental letters are not included in our proposed project fees. If required, these items will be billed according to the current Arias & Associates Unit Rate Schedule for Geotechnical Services.

As mentioned above, we are assuming at this time that the site is accessible for our drilling equipment and mechanical brush clearing will not be required to conduct our field exploration. If it is determined that mechanical brush clearing will be required to gain access to the boring locations, the fee for clearing will be invoiced separately.

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Report to Commissioners Court **Jan. 2014**Caldwell Co. Veterans Service Officer

Overview

January picked up right where December left off with continuing VA Pension services for the many, new claims that began last month. We were unable to submit any complete pension packages due to the myriad of untimely supporting documentation from nursing homes and doctors. As such, "Informal" pension claims were submitted to preserve a retroactive pay date if and when a favorable decision is received. The highlight for pensions in January was a favorable decision received after a lengthy and convoluted process with Pension Management Center. A maximum award was granted with retroactive payments back to May 1, 2012. In all, VA pension related assistance accounted for 40% of department business.

Service connected compensation claims and assistance ticked up in January accounting for 34 % of department business compared to 26% in December. General assistance accounted for 26%.



CALDWELL, MATHEW

CALDWELL, MATHEW (1798–1842). Mathew Caldwell, a signer of the Texas Declaration of Independence and soldier in the Texas army, was born in Kentucky on March 8, 1798. He moved to Missouri with his family in 1818 and settled in Texas in the DeWitt colony^{qv} in 1831. He has been called "the Paul Revere of the Texas Revolution" because he rode from Gonzales to Bastrop to call men to arms before the battle-of-Gonzales in October 1835; he was also called "Old Paint" because his whiskers were spotted. Caldwell served as one of the two delegates from Gonzales Municipality at the Convention of 1836 at Washington-on-the-Brazos. On March 2, 1836, after the signing of the Declaration of Independence, the convention dispatched couriers with the news and sent Caldwell with one of the couriers to the Texas army in order to ascertain the condition of the force and the movements of the enemy on the frontier.

On January 15, 1839, President Mirabeau B. Lamar named Caldwell captain of a company of rangers to be raised for the defense of Goliad. On March 23, 1839, Caldwell became captain of a company in the First Regiment of Infantry. He was wounded at the Council House Fight in March 1840 but headed a company at the battle of Plum Creek on August 12. As captain of Company D of the scouting force on the Texan Santa Fe expedition in 1841, he was captured with the expedition and imprisoned in Mexico. Upon release he hastened to the relief of San Antonio and on September 18, 1842, commanded a force of 200 men who met and defeated Adrián Woll in the battle of Salado Creek.

Caldwell was noted as married in the list of DeWitt colony settlers in 1831, but his first wife's name is not known; he married Mrs. Hannah Morrison in Washington County on May 17, 1837, and had at least three children. He died at his home in Gonzales on December 28, 1842, and was buried with military honors. Caldwell County, established in 1848, was named in his honor. In 1930 the state of Texas erected a monument at his grave in the cemetery at Gonzales.

SALE OR LEASE OF CALDWELL COUNTY REAL ESTATE

When the Caldwell County Commissioners Court desires to sell or lease county-owned real property, the county will use the following procedure as authorized by Tex. Local Gov't Code § 263.007. This procedure applies to all property owned or leased by the county except:

- property the county acquired with federal funds received for economic development purposes that the Commissioners Court desires to lease or convey under Tex. Local Gov'T Code § 272.001(i);
- property the Commissioners Court desires to lease or convey to an institution of higher education under Tex. Local Gov't Code § 272.001(j); or
- property the Commissioners Court desires to donate or sell for less than fair market value to another political subdivision under Tex. Local Gov't Code § 272.001(1).

CALDWELL COUNTY REAL ESTATE SEALED BID PROCEDURE

- 1. The Commissioners Court at an open meeting votes to seek bids for the sale or lease of the property.
- 2. The county will obtain an appraisal of the property's fair market value from a licensed real estate agent if the property if for sale and from a disinterested third party if the property is for lease. The county will not disclose the appraisal before the property is sold or leased.
- 3. The county will determine a minimum bid amount, based on this appraisal. The county will not disclose the minimum bid amount before the property is sold or leased.
- 4. The county will designate a time and place open to the public for opening the bids that is at least 21 days after it has determined the minimum bid amount.
- 5. The county will publish two notices of its intent to sell or lease the property in each county newspaper. The first notice will run at least 21 days before the date for opening the bids; the second notice will run at least 14 days before the date for opening the bids. The notices will include a description of the real property, including its location, and a description of the procedure by which sealed bids may be submitted.
- 6. At the designated time and place, the county will open each bid received and read the bid aloud. If the bids are opened at a Commissioners Court meeting, it will consider those bids during that meeting. If the bids are opened at another time, the Commissioners Court will consider those bids at its next meeting.
- 7. The Commissioners Court may reject any and all bids submitted. If it does so, the county will repeat steps 3 through 6 above unless the Commissioners Court at an open meeting votes to take the property off the market.

CALDWELL COUNTY ASSET DISPOSAL POLICY

The Caldwell County Commissioners Court recognizes that proper, appropriate, and lawful disposal of County-owned assets pursuant to subchapter D of chapter 263 of the Texas Local Government Code fulfills a public purpose. Therefore, the Caldwell County Commissioners Court finds it is in the public interest to adopt this Caldwell County Asset Disposal Policy. This policy applies to all non-real estate assets owned or controlled by Caldwell County.

No Caldwell County elected official or employee may sell, lease, trade, donate, give away, discard, destroy, or otherwise dispose of any county-owned asset except the Caldwell County Auditor, who shall do so only as authorized by the Caldwell County Commissioners Court pursuant to this policy.

DEFINITIONS

- 1. **Asset** means personal property, other than items routinely discarded as waste, including but not limited to vehicles, construction and maintenance equipment, tools, supplies, furniture, office equipment, construction materials, electronics and other property that is not real estate.
- 2. Salvage property means personal property, other than items routinely discarded as waste, that because of use, time, accident, or any other cause is so worn, damaged, or obsolete that it has no value for the purpose for which it was originally intended.
- 3. **Surplus property** means personal property that is not salvage property or items routinely discarded as waste; is not currently needed by its owner; is not required for the owner's foreseeable needs; and possesses some usefulness for the purpose for which it was intended.

DISPOSAL OF COUNTY-OWNED ASSETS

- 1. An elected official or department head who desires to dispose of county-owned assets must submit to the Commissioners Court a completed Caldwell County Asset Disposal Request Form (attached to this policy as Exhibit A) describing each asset and stating whether each asset is salvage property or surplus property and the reason for each designation.
- 2. The Commissioners Court must approve the accompanying Order to Dispose of County Asset(s).
- 3. The County Auditor must dispose of each asset according to the approved Order and state law.

SUBDIVISION AGREEMENT PROVIDING FOR REGULATION OF SUBDIVISION AND APPROVAL FOR COTTON CENTER

This Subdivision Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between Caldwell County, a political subdivision of the State of Texas ("County"), and Walton Texas, LP, a Texas limited partnership ("Primary Owner"), in its capacity as an owner and in its capacity as an operator and manager authorized to sign this Agreement on behalf of the Walton Individual Owners (Walton Texas and the Walton Individual Owners are referred to herein as "Owner"). The County and Owner are sometimes collectively herein references as the "Parties", and individually, as a "Party".

RECITALS

WHEREAS, counties are statutorily responsible for and have authority over platting and development review of certain subdivisions of real property, as well as the planning, construction, and maintenance of roads, stormwater management facilities, and other infrastructure in the unincorporated areas of counties; and

WHEREAS, in the parts of the unincorporated area that are within a city's extraterritorial jurisdiction ("ETJ"), municipalities have authority over platting and development review of subdivision of real property, as well as infrastructure and other aspects of land development under various statutes; and

WHEREAS, since counties and municipalities have different statutory authorities, fiscal resources, and constituencies, their respective interests in and policies governing infrastructure and development can differ as well; and

WHEREAS, review and approval of subdivision plats is the basic tool that counties and municipalities use to ensure that infrastructure and development in the ETJ are planned and constructed in a responsible manner; and

WHEREAS, Owner owns approximately 353 acres of land, more or less, located or to be located in the ETJ of the City of Martindale, Caldwell County, Texas, more particularly described in Exhibit "A" and referred to as "Cotton Center" or the "Property"; and

WHEREAS, Owner plans to develop Cotton Center as a master-planned mixed use community in accordance with this Agreement and that one certain Development Agreement dated ______, 2013 ("Development Agreement") between Owner and City of Martindale ("City"); and

WHEREAS, County and City have entered into an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement effective April 23, 2013 ("Interlocal Agreement") that establishes the review and approval process of subdivision plats and related permits in the City's ETJ, provided however the Interlocal Agreement authorizes a different process which may be described in a subsequent agreement to which the County is a party, and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into this Agreement which shall supersede the Interlocal Agreement as it relates to the review and approval process of subdivision plats and related permits in Cotton Center. The Parties agree that the Martindale Code of Ordinances attached as Exhibit "B" shall apply to the development of the Property, subject to the Development Standards and Design Standards attached as Exhibit "C", the Development Waivers attached as <a href="Exhibit "E", and the Parks, Trails and Open Space Plan attached as <a href="Exhibit "F". Owner shall not be required to comply with any provisions of the Martindale Code of Ordinances or the Caldwell County Development Ordinance which are inconsistent with the Development Standards, Design Standards and Development Waivers. The Martindale Code of Ordinances, Development Standards, Design Standards, Development Waivers, Land Use Plan, Parks, Trails and Open Space Plan are collectively herein referenced to as the "Cotton Center Regulations", which may be amended from time to time with the written consent of Primary Owner.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

I. Definitions.

- 1. "Owner" shall mean (i) Primary Owner, (ii) Walton Individual Owners or (iii) any subsequent owner of property in Cotton Center that is a successor or assignee of rights from Owner in accordance with Article VI Subsection 9(a) of this Agreement.
- 2. "Primary Owner" shall mean initially, Walton Texas, LP, and any entity to which Walton Texas, LP, may assign its rights and obligations as Primary Owner in accordance with Article VI Subsection 9(b) of this Agreement.

II. Duties and Responsibilities.

- 1. County designates City as the authority to enforce the provisions of the Cotton Center Regulations, including the authority to act as the sole coordinating entity for the review and approval process of development applications within Cotton Center, except as to those provisions within the Cotton Center Regulations that identify County responsibility in the review and approval process, either as shared between City and County or expressly reserved to County, and as set forth in this Agreement. To the extent they are not expressly reserved to County, such review and approval process shall be deemed to be delegated to City.
- 2. County designates the City to accept all fully completed applications for review in accordance with this Agreement, including but not limited to, preliminary plats, subdivision plats, and subdivision construction plans (the "Applications").
- 3. Owner shall pay to City all such City fees, and to the County all such County fees, in accordance with Exhibit "G". City shall notify County, by facsimile or email, of the amount of fees owed to County immediately upon acceptance of any Application. Applicants shall pay County fees to the Caldwell County Subdivision Coordinator, 1700 FM 2720, Lockhart, Texas 78644. City shall not approve on-site preparation or construction by an Applicant until County fees have been paid.
- 4. Owner, in coordination with City, shall forward a courtesy copy of all Applications to the County.

- 5. Owner, in coordination with City, shall confer with the Caldwell County 911 Addressing Division or the County's designated representatives concerning street names prior to final plat approval.
- 6. County designates the City to approve any Application that complies with this Agreement and the Cotton Center Regulations as such may be amended from time to time with the written consent of Primary Owner.
- 7. Owner, in coordination with City, shall deliver two (2) copies of all recorded plats for subdivisions within Cotton Center to County within ten (10) business days after the subdivision plat is recorded.
- 8. County shall have exclusive jurisdiction over approval, permitting, regulation and inspection of individual on-site sewage facilities in accordance with applicable state law. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("TCEQ") shall have complete authority over the review and approval process of any wastewater treatment plant used to serve the Property.

III. Inspection, Approval and Acceptance of Subdivision Infrastructure.

- 1. Unless noted otherwise in Article III Subsection 2 below, inspection and approval authority over stormwater drainage facilities located outside of the public right-of-way, water and wastewater facilities, and all other infrastructure within Cotton Center shall be the responsibility of a certified and state-licensed inspector mutually approved by City and Owner, acting under the supervision of City.
- 2. County shall inspect all facilities located within the public right-of-way in Cotton Center. Public roadways and stormwater drainage facilities located within the public right-of-way in Cotton Center shall be deemed approved and accepted if the facilities comply with this Agreement, the Cotton Center Regulations and State of Texas regulations.

IV. Maintenance of the Subdivision Infrastructure.

For those portions of the Property located in City's ETJ, County shall be responsible for 1. maintenance of the roads, bridges and their related appurtenances upon completion of the facilities and acceptance by County so long as such improvements have been installed in compliance with Section 154.110 or Section 154.111 of the City of Martindale Code of Ordinances, and so long as such improvements meet or exceed the requirements contained in this Agreement. County shall not be responsible for the maintenance of stormwater drainage facilities not located within the public right-of-way, or water and wastewater. The maintenance of stormwater drainage facilities located outside of the public right-of-way in the City's ETJ that serve Cotton Center shall be the responsibility of either a municipal utility district formed by Owner or an owners association formed by Owner. The municipal utility district shall also be responsible for maintenance of wastewater collection and transport facilities serving Cotton Center. The applicable utility provider shall be responsible for maintenance of water facilities and all other utility service facilities situated within Cotton Center, unless otherwise agreed by the Parties.

- 2. Upon annexation of the Property into City's full purpose jurisdiction, City shall be responsible for maintenance of all publicly dedicated and accepted roads including their related appurtenances, stormwater drainage facilities, and all wastewater collection and treatment facilities.
- 3. County shall grant easements to a municipal utility district or an owners association, as may be reasonably requested or necessary, for purposes of maintaining, replacing or relocating drainage facilities located within public rights of way. A municipal utility district or owners association that is granted such easement shall not interfere with or damage existing utilities within the easement or restrict access or use of the easement by County or other entities approved by County. Where such easement is granted, the surface area of the easement shall be returned to at least the pre-use condition after any use by a municipal utility district or owners association.

V. Development

- 1. <u>Vesting.</u> Owner has vested authority to develop the Property in accordance with this Agreement, the Cotton Center Regulations, and any applicable City requirements. Owner shall be deemed vested from the Effective Date of this Agreement. To the extent that any current or future County development regulations conflict with this Agreement or the Cotton Center Regulations, this Agreement and the Cotton Center Regulations shall prevail unless otherwise agreed by Owner. Vested rights under this Agreement shall not supersede mandated current or future state regulations and/or regulatory actions required by County that are intended to prevent imminent, foreseeable harm to human safety or property, except as otherwise provided in this Agreement.
- 2. Development Rights. County agrees that it shall not, during the term of this Agreement, impose: a) any moratorium on building or development of or within the Cotton Center subdivision if such building or development complies with this Agreement, or b) any land use or development regulation that limits density or timing of development approvals within Cotton Center. This section shall not apply to temporary actions by County that are required to prevent imminent, foreseeable harm to human safety or property.
- 3. <u>Controlling Ordinances, Manuals, and/or Rules.</u> County's rules and regulations related to subdivisions and development as they pertain to Cotton Center, including but not limited to all land development regulations, are hereby replaced in their entirety with this Agreement, the Cotton Center Regulations and applicable City requirements.

VI. Miscellaneous.

- 1. <u>General Administration</u>. The Caldwell County Development Services Department Director or his or her representative shall be responsible for administering this Agreement on behalf of County.
- 2. <u>Severability</u>. Any clause, sentence, provision, paragraph, or article of this Agreement held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, illegal, or ineffective shall not impair, invalidate, or nullify the remainder of this Agreement, but the effect thereof shall be confined to the clause, sentence, provision, paragraph, or article so held to be invalid, illegal, or ineffective.

- 3. <u>No Third Party Beneficiaries</u>. Nothing in this Agreement, express or implied, is intended to confer upon any person, other than the Parties, any benefits, rights, or remedies beyond any such benefits, rights, or remedies that may be created by Chapter 242, Local Government Code.
- 4. <u>Duration</u>. The term of this Agreement shall be from the date it is formally and duly executed by the Parties until the earlier of: (i) the Development Agreement is no longer in effect for Cotton Center, (ii) written termination of this Agreement by the Parties, or (iii) forty five (45) years from the effective date of this Agreement.
- 5. Preservation of Powers. Nothing in this Agreement is intended or shall be construed to limit the power or authority under applicable laws of County to adopt, modify, or enforce subdivision regulations in the ETJ, or to limit the power or authority of County to make additional agreements under applicable laws as County believes may be necessary or desirable so long as any unilateral adoption of subdivision regulations in the ETJ by the County (that is, without the consent of Primary Owner) is enforced or affects only land that is outside the scope of this Agreement.
- 6. <u>Notice.</u> All notices sent pursuant to this Agreement shall be in writing and must be sent by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested to:

Either Party shall have the right from time to time to change their respective address, and shall have the right to specify as its address any other address within the United States of America by a least five (5) days written notice to the other Party.

- 7. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between County and Owner as it relates to the review and approval of subdivisions in Cotton Center. The Parties recognize the Development Agreement authorized pursuant to Chapter 212.172 of the Texas Local Government Code will be executed by the City and Owner and that such agreement may be modified in the future. The Parties agree that if there is a conflict between this Agreement and the Development Agreement as it solely relates to the review and approval of subdivision applications, the Cotton Center Regulations shall prevail.
- 8. <u>Amendment</u>. This Agreement may be amended only by a written agreement signed and executed by (i) an authorized representative of County and Primary Owner, or (ii) all the then current owners of all portions of Cotton Center (other than end-buyers of fully developed and improved lots). An owner of a portion of Cotton Center (other than an end-buyer of a fully developed and improved lot), and County may amend this Agreement as it relates solely to such owner's parcel without the joinder of any other landowner, provided that the Primary Owner must be party to such amendment if the Primary Owner still owns any portion of Cotton Center. In addition, as long as Primary Owner owns any land within Cotton Center, Primary Owner and County may amend this Agreement without the joinder of any other landowner.
- 9. Assignment; Transferability.
- (a) Owner Assignment. Owner may assign this Agreement with respect to all or part of such Owner's ownership portion of Cotton Center from time to time to a purchaser of all or a portion of Cotton Center. Any assignment must be in writing, must set forth the assigned rights and obligations without modification or amendment, and must be executed by Owner and the proposed assignee. Owner shall provide City, County and Primary Owner notice of each such assignment, including a copy of the assignment. Upon such assignment or partial assignment, Owner shall be fully released as it relates to the property so assigned from any and all obligations under this Agreement and shall have no further liability with


respect to the part of Cotton Center so assigned, except as to a default that occurred prior to the date of the assignment, provided that the assignee assumes any and all obligations under this Agreement applicable to the part of Cotton Center included in the assignment. A default by any subsequent assignee shall not constitute a default by Owner under this Agreement, but only under such partial assignment.

- (b) Primary Owner Assignment. Primary Owner may assign, in whole but not in part, its rights and obligations as Primary Owner so long as it owns any portion of the Property (the "Ownership Threshold"), provided that the assignee assumes any and all obligations under this Agreement applicable to the part of Cotton Center included in the assignment. Notice of all assignments of the rights and obligations of the Primary Owner shall be given to the County within fifteen (15) days after execution, and thereafter such notice shall be recorded in the real property records of the County. When Primary Owner, together with its affiliates, no longer satisfies the Ownership Threshold, the rights and obligations of the Primary Owner shall automatically terminate.
- 10. <u>Agreement Binds Succession and Runs with the Property</u>. This Agreement shall bind and insure to the benefit of the Parties, their successors and assigns. The terms of this Agreement shall constitute covenants running with the land comprising Cotton Center and shall be binding on all future owners of the property in Cotton Center.
- 11. Additional Land. County acknowledges that an Owner may, in the future, desire to add additional land to Cotton Center and that is subject to this Agreement. If an Owner owns or acquires additional land that the Owner desires to add to Cotton Center and this Agreement, the Owner must obtain consent from the Primary Owner and the County to add such property to the Project. If the County approves the addition of the additional land, Owner and County agree that the additional land shall become part of Cotton Center which shall be subject to the terms of this Agreement.

2. The City Engineer shall approve the placement of traffic signs or guard rails. Traffic signs, guardrails and other traffic control devices shall be shown on the construction plans.


E. STREETLIGHTS

- 1. Streetlight standards. Streetlights shall be located as follows:
 - a. At the intersection of two arterial streets, an arterial and a collector street, and at the intersection of two collector streets;
 - b. In the turnaround of cul-de-sac where the cul-de-sac length is longer than 300 feet;
 - c. Not less than one streetlight for each 500 linear feet of streets within or abutting the subdivision;
 - d. Along arterial and collector streets, with a maximum spacing between lights of 300 feet;
 - e. If the block length is over 600 feet but less than 900 feet, in mid-block to the degree practical; and
 - f. To illuminate street curves, significant topographic conditions, and other safety hazards.
- 2. *Construction*. Metal poles shall be required for all street lighting.
- 3. **Payment of Utility Company Charges.** Owner shall pay all utility company charges for street lighting (e.g., underground, metal poles, special fixtures, charges for electricity, etc.) upon installation and use of any street lighting.
- 4. *Timing.* Installation will be completed during the construction of the other infrastructure and public improvements or, with City approval, installation may be coordinated with building permits issued in the area. Priority shall be given to arterial and collector streets in the subdivision. Within each block street, lights will be installed when fifty percent (50%) of lots have been permitted. Owner shall provide security to City as necessary to ensure installation of lighting that is scheduled for future installation. This light installation schedule may be accelerated in accordance with an agreement made with Owner whereby Owner pays the City the full cost of power during the time period necessary to reach this level of permitting.

<u>Texas Transportation Code ANN. § 228.0055: Texas Statutes - Section 228.0055: USE OF CONTRACT PAYMENTS AND OTHER REVENUE</u>

- (a) Payments, project savings, refinancing dividends, and any other revenue received by the commission or the department under a comprehensive development agreement shall be used by the commission or the department to finance the construction, maintenance, or operation of transportation projects or air quality projects in the region.
- (b) The department shall allocate the distribution of funds to department districts in the region that are located in the boundaries of the metropolitan planning organization in which the project that is the subject of the comprehensive development agreement is located based on the percentage of toll revenue from users from each department district of the project. To assist the department in determining the allocation, each entity responsible for collecting tolls for a project shall calculate on an annual basis the percentage of toll revenue from users of the project from each department district based on the number of recorded electronic toll collections.
- (c) The commission or the department may not:
 - (1) revise the formula as provided in the department's unified transportation program, or its successor document, in a manner that results in a decrease of a department district's allocation because of a payment under Subsection (a); or
 - (2) take any other action that would reduce funding allocated to a department district because of payments received under a comprehensive development agreement.
- (d) A metropolitan planning organization may not take any action that would reduce distribution of funds or other resources to a department district because of the use of a payment or other revenue under Subsection (a).

Texas Transportation Code ANN. § 228.001: Texas Statutes - Section 228.001: DEFINITIONS In this chapter:

- (1) "Air quality project" means a project or program of the department or another governmental entity that the commission determines will mitigate or prevent air pollution caused by the construction, maintenance, or use of public roads.
- (2) "Bond" means bonds, notes, or other obligations issued under Subchapter C or another law with respect to a toll project or system.
- (3) "Region" means:
 - (A) a metropolitan statistical area and any county contiguous to that metropolitan statistical area; or
 - (B) two adjacent districts of the department.
- (4) "System" means a toll project or any combination of toll projects designated as a system under Section 228.010.
- (5) "Toll project" has the meaning assigned by Section 201.001(b).
- (6) "Transportation project" means:
 - (A) a tolled or nontolled state highway improvement project;
 - (B) a toll project eligible for department cost participation under Section 222.103;
 - (C) the acquisition, construction, maintenance, or operation of a rail facility or system under Chapter 91;
 - (D) the acquisition, construction, maintenance, or operation of a state-owned ferry under Subchapter A, Chapter 342;
 - (E) a public transportation project under Chapter 455 or 456;
 - (F) the establishment, construction, or repair of an aviation facility under Chapter 21; and
 - (G) a passenger rail project of another governmental entity.

Title 23, Chapter 1 §133. Surface transportation program

- (a) Establishment.-The Secretary shall establish a surface transportation program in accordance with this section.
- (b) Eligible Projects.-A State may obligate funds apportioned to it under section 104(b)(2) for the surface transportation program only for the following:
 - (1) Construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation, resurfacing, restoration, preservation, or operational improvements for highways, including construction of designated routes of the Appalachian development highway system and local access roads under section 14501 of title 40.
 - (2) Replacement (including replacement with fill material), rehabilitation, preservation, protection (including painting, scour countermeasures, seismic retrofits, impact protection measures, security countermeasures, and protection against extreme events) and application of calcium magnesium acetate, sodium acetate/formate, or other environmentally acceptable, minimally corrosive anti-icing and deicing compositions for bridges (and approaches to bridges and other elevated structures) and tunnels on public roads of all functional classifications, including any such construction or reconstruction necessary to accommodate other transportation modes.
 - (3) Construction of a new bridge or tunnel at a new location on a Federal-aid highway.
 - (4) Inspection and evaluation of bridges and tunnels and training of bridge and tunnel inspectors (as defined in section 144), and inspection and evaluation of other highway assets (including signs, retaining walls, and drainage structures).
 - (5) Capital costs for transit projects eligible for assistance under chapter 53 of title 49, including vehicles and facilities, whether publicly or privately owned, that are used to provide intercity passenger service by bus.
 - (6) Carpool projects, fringe and corridor parking facilities and programs, including electric vehicle and natural gas vehicle infrastructure in accordance with section 137, bicycle transportation and pedestrian walkways in accordance with section 217, and the modifications of public sidewalks to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.).
 - (7) Highway and transit safety infrastructure improvements and programs, installation of safety barriers and nets on bridges, hazard eliminations, projects to mitigate hazards caused by wildlife, and railway-highway grade crossings.
 - (8) Highway and transit research and development and technology transfer programs.
 - (9) Capital and operating costs for traffic monitoring, management, and control facilities and programs, including advanced truck stop electrification systems.
 - (10) Surface transportation planning programs.
 - (11) Transportation alternatives.
 - (12) Transportation control measures listed in section 108(f)(1)(A) (other than clause (xvi)) of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7408(f)(1)(A)).
 - (13) Development and establishment of management systems 1
 - (14) Environmental mitigation efforts relating to projects funded under this title in the same manner and to the same extent as such activities are eligible under section 119(g).
 - (15) Projects relating to intersections that-
 - (A) have disproportionately high accident rates;
 - (B) have high levels of congestion, as evidenced by-

- (i) interrupted traffic flow at the intersection; and
- (ii) a level of service rating that is not better than "F" during peak travel hours, calculated in accordance with the Highway Capacity Manual issued by the Transportation Research Board; and
- (C) are located on a Federal-aid highway.
- (16) Infrastructure-based intelligent transportation systems capital improvements.
- (17) Environmental restoration and pollution abatement in accordance with section 328.
- (18) Control of noxious weeds and aquatic noxious weeds and establishment of native species in accordance with section 329.
- (19) Projects and strategies designed to support congestion pricing, including electric toll collection and travel demand management strategies and programs.
- (20) Recreational trails projects eligible for funding under section 206.
- (21) Construction of ferry boats and ferry terminal facilities eligible for funding under section 129(c).
- (22) Border infrastructure projects eligible for funding under section 1303 of the SAFETEA-LU (23 U.S.C. 101 note; Public Law 109-59).
- (23) Truck parking facilities eligible for funding under section 1401 of the MAP-21.
- (24) Development and implementation of a State asset management plan for the National Highway System in accordance with section 119, including data collection, maintenance, and integration and the costs associated with obtaining, updating, and licensing software and equipment required for risk based asset management and performance based management, and for similar activities related to the development and implementation of a performance based management program for other public roads.
- (25) A project that, if located within the boundaries of a port terminal, includes only such surface transportation infrastructure modifications as are necessary to facilitate direct intermodal interchange, transfer, and access into and out of the port.
- (26) Construction and operational improvements for any minor collector if-
 - (A) the minor collector, and the project to be carried out with respect to the minor collector, are in the same corridor as, and in proximity to, a Federal-aid highway designated as part of the National Highway System;
 - (B) the construction or improvements will enhance the level of service on the Federalaid highway described in subparagraph (A) and improve regional traffic flow; and (C) the construction or improvements are more cost-effective, as determined by a benefit-cost analysis, than an improvement to the Federal-aid highway described in subparagraph (A).
- (c) Location of Projects.-Surface transportation program projects may not be undertaken on roads functionally classified as local or rural minor collectors unless the roads were on a Federal-aid highway system on January 1, 1991, except-
 - (1) as provided in subsection (g);
 - (2) for projects described in paragraphs (2), (4), (6), (7), (11), (20), (25), and (26) of subsection (b); and
 - (3) as approved by the Secretary.

Under 23 U.S.C. 213(b), eligible activities under the TAP program consist of:

- 1. Transportation Alternatives as defined in 23 U.S.C. 101(a)(29) (MAP-21 §1103):
 - A. Construction, planning, and design of on-road and off-road trail facilities for pedestrians, bicyclists, and other nonmotorized forms of transportation, including sidewalks, bicycle infrastructure, pedestrian and bicycle signals, traffic calming techniques, lighting and other safety-related infrastructure, and transportation projects to achieve compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 USC 12101 et seq.).
 - B. Construction, planning, and design of infrastructure-related projects and systems that will provide safe routes for non-drivers, including children, older adults, and individuals with disabilities to access daily needs.
 - C. Conversion and use of abandoned railroad corridors for trails for pedestrians, bicyclists, or other nonmotorized transportation users.
 - D. Construction of turnouts, overlooks, and viewing areas.
 - E. Community improvement activities, which include but are not limited to:
 - i. inventory, control, or removal of outdoor advertising;
 - ii. historic preservation and rehabilitation of historic transportation facilities;
 - iii. vegetation management practices in transportation rights-of-way to improve roadway safety, prevent against invasive species, and provide erosion control; and
 - iv. archaeological activities relating to impacts from implementation of a transportation project eligible under title 23.
 - F. Any environmental mitigation activity, including pollution prevention and pollution abatement activities and mitigation to
 - i. address stormwater management, control, and water pollution prevention or abatement related to highway construction or due to highway runoff, including activities described in sections 133(b)(11), 328(a), and 329 of title 23; or
 - ii. reduce vehicle-caused wildlife mortality or to restore and maintain connectivity among terrestrial or aquatic habitats.
- 2. The recreational trails program under section 206 of title 23.
- 3. The safe routes to school program eligible projects and activities listed at section 1404(f) of the SAFETEA-LU:
 - A. Infrastructure-related projects.
 - B. Noninfrastructure-related activities.
 - C. Safe Routes to School coordinator.
- 4. Planning, designing, or constructing boulevards and other roadways largely in the right-of-way of former Interstate System routes or other divided highways.

TAP funds cannot be used for:

- State or MPO administrative purposes, except for SRTS administration, and administrative costs of the State permitted for RTP set-aside funds.
- Promotional activities, except as permitted under the SRTS.
- General recreation and park facilities, playground equipment, sports fields, campgrounds, picnic areas and pavilions, etc.
- Routine maintenance and operations.

Careful consideration should be given to whether an activity falls within the eligibilities created under TAP. Section 1103 of MAP-21 eliminated the definition of transportation enhancement activities in section 101 of title 23 and inserted in its place a definition of transportation alternatives. The transportation alternatives definition contained in 23 U.S.C. 101(a)(29) created different categories of activities than those included under the previous transportation enhancement definition. As a result, some activities that were previously eligible as independent transportation enhancement projects are no longer eligible; some categories of eligibility remain, but for a different range of activities. In some cases, activities that are no longer eligible for funding as independent TAP projects may be eligible for FHWA participation under other title 23 provisions, such as project mitigation measures when determined necessary to mitigate project impacts (including the impacts of a TAP project). Transportation enhancement categories that are no longer expressly described as eligible activities under the definition of transportation alternatives are:

- Safety and educational activities for pedestrians and bicyclists. Exception: Activities
 targeting children in Kindergarten through 8th grade are eligible under SRTS (an eligible
 activity under the TAP funding). Note: Some of these activities may be eligible under HSIP.
 Nonconstruction projects for bicycle safety remain broadly eligible for STP funds.
- Acquisition of scenic easements and scenic or historic sites (including historic battlefields), and scenic or historic highway programs (including tourist and welcome center facilities).
 Exceptions: A few specific activities under this category are eligible for funding as TAP projects, including construction of turnouts, overlooks, and viewing areas; historic preservation and rehabilitation of historic transportation facilities; and bicycle and pedestrian facilities.
- Landscaping and other scenic beautification. However, under the "community improvement activities" category, projects such as streetscaping and corridor landscaping may be eligible under TAP if selected through the required competitive process. States may use TAP funds to meet junkyard screening and removal requirements under 23 U.S.C. 136 if selected through the competitive process. Landscaping and scenic enhancement features, including junkyard removal and screening, may be eligible as part of the construction of any Federal-aid highway project under 23 U.S.C. 319, including TAP-funded projects.
- Historic preservation, and rehabilitation and operation of historic buildings, structures, or facilities (including historic railroad facilities and canals). Historic preservation activities now are limited to historic preservation and rehabilitation activities relating to a historic transportation facility. See section 101(a)(29)(E). Operation of historic transportation facilities is not eligible under TAP.
- Archaeological planning and research. Under TAP, archaeological activities must relate to impacts from implementation of a transportation project eligible under title 23.
- Establishment of transportation museums. There is no eligibility for this activity under TAP.
