

Caldwell County Courthouse Grounds – Lawn Protection Guidelines

The Caldwell County Courthouse Grounds are an important public space. These guidelines are intended to help protect the recently replanted courthouse lawn and preserve the grounds for long-term community use.

Protection of the Courthouse Lawn

- The courthouse lawn should be treated with care to protect landscaping and irrigation systems.
- Access to portions of the lawn may be limited or restricted as determined by the Office of the County Judge.

Event Location Determination

- The Office of the County Judge determines the approved location for activities on the courthouse grounds.
- Applicants must follow all location designations or layout instructions provided during the event approval process.

Ground Protection

- No staking, digging, or penetration of the lawn surface is permitted.
- No equipment or activities that could damage landscaping or irrigation systems are allowed unless specifically approved.

Signage and Event Guidance

- Temporary signage or visual markers may be required by event organizers to guide attendees and protect landscaped areas.
- Event organizers may be asked to assist in communicating lawn protection guidance to attendees.

Coordination With Other Agencies

- Event organizers may need to coordinate with the City of Lockhart or other agencies regarding street closures, safety planning, or permits.

These guidelines support the implementation of the Caldwell County Courthouse Grounds Use Policy and are intended to help preserve the courthouse grounds for future community use.
