RECOGNIZING APRIL 2025
AS CALDWELL COUNTY SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS AND PREVENTION MONTH**

- WHEREAS:** Six million three hundred thousand Texans have experienced some form of sexual assault in their lifetime; and
- WHEREAS:** Two in five women, and one in five men, in Texas have been sexually assaulted in their lifetime affecting all races, ages, genders and economic situations; and
- WHEREAS:** The Hays-Caldwell Women's Center provided direct services to 667 adult victims of sexual assault in Hays and Caldwell Counties last year; and
- WHEREAS:** Caldwell County is intolerant of sexual violence in any form and recognizes that education and awareness may prevent sexual assault; and
- WHEREAS:** Efforts to reduce sexual assault can only be successful through citizen involvement, and the safety of the citizens of Caldwell County depends upon our actions to end sexual assault.
