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

IRS sets 2026 business standard mileage rate at 72.5 cents per mile, up 2.5 cents

IR-2025-128, Dec. 29, 2025

WASHINGTON — The Internal Revenue Service today announced that the optional standard mileage rate for business use of automobiles will increase by 2.5 cents in 2026, while the mileage rate for vehicles used for medical purposes will decrease by half a cent, reflecting updated cost data and annual inflation adjustments.

Optional standard mileage rates are used to calculate the deductible costs of operating vehicles for business, charitable, and medical purposes. Additionally, the optional standard mileage rate may be used to calculate the deductible costs of operating vehicles for moving purposes for certain active-duty members of the Armed Forces, and now, under the One, Big, Beautiful Bill, certain members of the intelligence community.

Beginning Jan. 1, 2026, the standard mileage rates for the use of a car, van, pickup or panel truck will be:

- 72.5 cents per mile [driven for business use](#), up 2.5 cents from 2025.
- 20.5 cents per mile driven for medical purposes, down a half cent from 2025.
- 20.5 cents per mile driven for moving purposes for certain active-duty members of the Armed Forces (and now certain members of the intelligence community), reduced by a half cent from last year.
- 14 cents per mile driven in service of charitable organizations, equal to the rate in 2025.

The rates apply to fully-electric and hybrid automobiles, as well as gasoline and diesel-powered vehicles.

While the mileage rate for charitable use is set by statute, the mileage rate for business use is based on an annual study of the fixed and variable costs of operating an automobile. The rate for medical and moving purposes, meanwhile, is based on only the variable costs from the annual study.

Under the law, taxpayers cannot claim a miscellaneous itemized deduction for unreimbursed employee travel expenses, except for certain educator expenses. However, deductions for expenses that are deductible in determining adjusted gross income remain allowable, such as for certain members of a reserve component of the Armed Forces, certain state and local government officials, certain performing artists, and eligible educators. Alternatively, eligible educators may claim an itemized deduction for certain unreimbursed employee travel expenses. In addition, only taxpayers who are members of the military on active duty or certain members of the intelligence community may claim a deduction for moving expenses incurred while relocating under orders to a permanent change of station.

Use of the standard mileage rates is optional. Taxpayers may instead choose to calculate the actual costs of using their vehicle.

Taxpayers using the standard mileage rate for a vehicle they own and use for business must choose to use the rate in the first year the automobile is available for business use. Then, in later years, they can choose to use the standard mileage rate or actual expenses.

For a leased vehicle, taxpayers using the standard mileage rate must employ that method for the entire lease period, including renewals.

[Notice-2026-10](#)  contains the optional 2026 standard mileage rates, as well as the maximum automobile cost used to calculate mileage reimbursement allowances under a fixed-and variable rate plan. The notice also provides the maximum fair market value of employer-provided automobiles first made available to employees for personal use in 2026 for which employers may calculate mileage allowances using a cents-per-mile valuation rule or the fleet-average-valuation rule.



THIS INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT regarding the City of Lockhart, Texas Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone Number _____ (the "Agreement") is made and entered into by and between the City of Lockhart, Texas, a home rule municipality (the "City"), and Caldwell County, a political subdivision of the State of Texas (the "County" and, together with the City, the "Parties") under the authority of Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code and Chapter 311 of the Texas Tax Code for the participation of the City and the County in Reinvestment Zone Number _____, City of Lockhart, Texas, (the "Zone") created by the City pursuant to Chapter 311 of the Texas Tax Code.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the Act (as defined below), the City Council of the City (the "City Council"), pursuant to Ordinance No. _____ (the "TIRZ Ordinance") adopted on _____, 20_____, created, established, and designated the Zone under the Act, attached hereto as Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, in the TIRZ Ordinance, the City found that the designation of the Zone would encourage the development of property in and around the Zone; and

WHEREAS, in the TIRZ Ordinance, the City contributed twenty-three percent (23%) of the City's ad valorem real property taxes collected and received by the City on the Captured Appraised Value (as defined below) in the Zone (all as defined in the Final Plan (as defined below)) in years 2026-2035 and twenty-eight and one half percent (28.5%) of the City's ad valorem real property taxes collected and received by the City on the Captured Appraised Value in years 2036-2065 and recognized the County's participation in the Zone through its contribution of twenty-three percent (23.0%) of the County's maintenance and operations ad valorem real property taxes collected and received by the County on Captured Appraised Value in the Zone in years 2026-2035 and twenty-eight and one half percent (28.5%) of the County's maintenance and operations ad valorem real property taxes collected and received by the County on Captured Appraised Value in the Zone in years 2036-2065; and

WHEREAS, in consideration of the County's participation in the Zone, the County shall have the authority to appoint two members to the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Final Plan includes [insert general or specific public infrastructure projects] that benefit the County and its residents; and

WHEREAS, in consideration of special benefit to the County created by the projects financed by the Zone, including transportation and capital improvements for public use, the County is authorized to appropriate funding under this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the County's participation in the Zone will greatly enhance the implementation of the Zone by the City; and

WHEREAS, both the City and the County will benefit from the development and improvements paid with the TIRZ Fund in accordance with the documents creating the Zone; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code, the City and the

County are entering into this Agreement to set forth the conditions governing the contribution of the [TIRZ Increment Receipts] (as defined in the Final Plan) by the City and current, annually-appropriated funds by the County, and the City finds that this Agreement is necessary for the implementation of the Final Plan for the Zone; and

NOW THEREFORE, the City and the County, in consideration of the terms, conditions, and covenants contained herein, hereby agree as follows:

SECTION 1. Incorporation of Recitals. The Parties hereby agree that the recitals set forth above form the basis upon which they have entered into this Agreement.

SECTION 2. Definitions. In addition to any terms defined in the body of this Agreement, the following terms shall have the definitions ascribed to them as follows:

(a) **Act** means the Tax Increment Financing Act, as amended and as codified as Chapter 311 of the Texas Tax Code.

(b) **Board** means the governing board of directors of the Zone appointed in accordance with Section 311.009 of the Act, the TIRZ Ordinance, and this Agreement.

(c) **Captured Appraised Value** in a given year means the total appraised value, less any applicable exemptions, of all real property of the Zone taxable by the City or the County for that tax year less the Tax Increment Base defined in Section (i) below.

(d) **County TIRZ Increment** means the amount of the County maintenance and operations tax levy on the Captured Appraised Value which the County agrees to contribute to the TIRZ Fund of the Zone pursuant to Sections 3(a) and 3(b) of this Agreement.

(e) **Final Plan** means the project and finance plan for the Zone, with a preliminary form thereof attached hereto as Exhibit "B," and such amendments and revisions thereto as may be approved by the City Council.

(f) **Project Costs** shall have the meaning assigned to such term in the Final Plan.

(g) **TIRZ Fund** means that fund created by the City pursuant to Section 311.014 of the Act and the TIRZ Ordinance, which will be maintained by the City, and into which all revenues of the TIRZ Increment Receipts (as defined in the Final Plan) will be deposited, and by such other taxing units with jurisdiction over real property in the Zone that may enter into agreements for such contributions.

(h) **Tax Increment** means the amount of property taxes levied and collected by the City or County for that year on the Captured Appraised Value of real property taxable by the City or County and located in the Zone; provided however, the County Tax Increment shall be calculated only on the County's maintenance and operations property tax levy.

(i) **Tax Increment Base** means the total appraised value as of _____, 20____, of all real property taxable by the City or the County, as applicable, and located in the Zone.

(j) **TIRZ Fund** shall have the meaning assigned to such term in the Final Plan.

(k) **Zone** means the Reinvestment Zone Number _____, City of Lockhart, Texas, approved by City of Lockhart, Texas Ordinance No. _____.

(l) Terms other than those defined above shall: (1) have their meanings as given in the Act; (2) the Final Plan; (3) the recitals hereof; or (4) if not so defined, their usual and ordinary meanings.

(m) References to state statutes shall include amendments to those statutes that are duly enacted from time to time.

SECTION 3. Obligations of the County.

(a) **County TIRZ Increment.** The County agrees to pay current, annually appropriated funds to the City for deposit into the TIRZ Fund created by the City for the Zone in an amount equal to twenty-three percent (23.0%) of the County's maintenance and operations ad valorem real property taxes collected and received by the County on Captured Appraised Value in the Zone in years 2026-2035 and twenty-eight and one half percent (28.5%) of the County's maintenance and operations ad valorem real property taxes collected and received by the County on Captured Appraised Value in the Zone in years 2036-2065 (which expressly excludes the portion of real property taxes collected and received associated with debt service and road and bridge maintenance and operations). The County's obligation to make these payments accrues only after taxes on the Captured Appraised Value are collected by the County. Payment shall be due on _____, 20____ and on _____ of each year during the term of this Agreement. No interest or penalty will be charged to the County for any payments made by the County based on collections that occur after this due date. The County may offset against future payments of the County TIRZ Increment any portion of payments to the City under this Agreement that the County subsequently refunds to taxpayers pursuant to the provision of the Texas Tax Code. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, the County TIRZ Increment shall not fund any payments under any 380 Agreement entered into between the City and any other entity responsible for developing the Zone, unless the use of the County TIRZ Increment for that purpose is approved by a majority vote of the Commissioners Court. The County hereby acknowledges that the Seawillow Ranch Development Agreement entered by the City and RODG DT SEAWILLOW PROPCO LLC, on August 2, 2024 ("Development Agreement"), and the First Amendment to the Development Agreement approved by the Lockhart City Council on _____, 2026 are not 380 Agreements and thus, do not need to be approved by the Commissioners Court.

(b) **Limitations on Payments.** The County is not obligated to make payments under this Agreement: (a) unless and until taxes on the Captured Appraised Value are actually collected by the County; or b) in any amount greater than taxes actually collected on the Captured Appraised Value. No interest or penalty will be charged to the County for any late payment received from the County. However, the penalty and interest received by the County on any delinquent taxes from the County shall be paid to the City and deposited into the TIRZ Fund, less any collection fees incurred by the County. For and during the term of this Agreement, the County shall not enter into any agreements (including, but not limited to, tax abatement agreements and Texas Local Government Code "381 Economic Development Agreements") with respect to the Zone that would reduce the County Increment without the written consent of the City following approval by the City Council.

(c) The Project.

- (1) The obligation of the County to participate in the Zone is limited to those portions of the property which are within the City's corporate boundaries and within the boundaries of the Zone, as described in the Final Plan. In accordance with the provisions of Section 311.007 of the Act, the City may change the boundaries of the Zone. The County's participation does not extend to the Tax Increment on any additional property added to the Zone unless the Commissioners Court specifically agrees to participate in the additional area. The projects of the Zone are and shall be those described in the Final Plan, as adopted upon recommendation of the Board and approved by the City Council, with the preliminary form being attached hereto as Exhibit "B".
- (2) In accordance with the provisions of Section 311.011(e) of the Act, the City Council may amend the Final Plan; provided, however, no project expenditures of County TIRZ Increment provided under this Agreement shall be authorized without an affirmative vote of the Board, with the County representatives present for the vote and with the County representatives unanimously agreeing with a proposed expenditure. In the event that the County representatives do not unanimously agree with a proposed expenditure or they both fail to attend the Board meeting when such item is being considered, County TIRZ Increment provided under this Agreement may not be utilized for that expenditure unless and until a subsequent vote of the Commissioners Court approves of such expenditure and the County agrees to place such County TIRZ Increment expenditure item on a Commissioner's Court agenda within thirty (30) days following receipt of a written request of the City. Any future amendments to the Final Plan shall only apply to those portions of property which have been incorporated into the corporate boundaries of the City.

(d) Development in the Zone. Projects within the boundaries of the Zone shall be developed as closely as possible in conformity with the Final Plan. As stated above, County funds will only be used for projects that have been approved by the County members of the Board or by the Commissioners Court.

(e) County Appointment to the Board. The Board shall consist of nine (9) voting members. The Commissioners Court shall have the unequivocal right to appoint two (2) qualified voting members during the period that the TIRZ Fund created under this Agreement contains funds. The City Council shall have the right to appoint seven (7) qualified voting members during the length of the Zone as established by the TIRZ Ordinance. Members of the Board shall meet the qualifications set forth in Section 311.009 of the Act. Failure of the Commissioners Court to appoint a person to the Board shall not be deemed a waiver of the County's right to make an appointment at a later date. The Commissioners Court will make best faith efforts to appoint a qualified person to serve on the Board, and to fill vacancies in the positions as needed. Should the County fail to appoint two (2) Board members or if there is a vacancy in a County-appointed Board seat for more than sixty (60) days, then Subsection 3(c)(2) above shall not apply for so long as at least one (1) County-appointed Board position remains vacant beyond such sixty (60) days and the project expenditures of County TIRZ Increment in the Final Plan can be approved in accordance with the Act.

SECTION 4. Obligations of the City.

(a) Use of County Payments. The City agrees to use payments made by the County under this Agreement solely to fund Project Costs and Administrative Fees subject to the conditions

set forth in this Agreement.

(b) **Notice to County of Amendments to Final Plan.** The City agrees to provide the County with written notice of any proposed amendments to the Final Plan at least fourteen (14) days prior to their submission to the City Council for approval. The City agrees to work with the Board to implement the Final Plan.

(c) **Disposition of Tax Increments.** Upon termination of the Zone, and after all obligations of the Zone have been paid, the City agrees to pay to the County, within sixty (60) days of the termination, all monies remaining in the TIRZ Fund that represent the County's pro rata amount of participation authorized under this Agreement.

(d) **Annual Reports/ Right to Audit.** The City agrees to provide to the County an annual report regarding the Zone as required under Section 311.016 of the Act. Additionally, the County shall have the right to audit the books and records of the Zone upon providing at least 10 days' written notice to the City. Such an audit shall occur between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on business days and shall be paid for by the County.

SECTION 5. Term and Termination.

The term of this Agreement, unless extended by mutual agreement of the County and the City, shall commence upon execution by the last party and shall last until the earlier of: (1) _____, 20____; or (2) the date all Project Costs have been paid or reimbursed unless earlier terminated by the parties hereto. Nothing in this Agreement limits the authority of the County or City to extend the term of this Agreement. Upon termination of this Agreement, the obligation of the County to make payments to the City shall end; however, the County's Board appointment powers shall survive the termination.

SECTION 6. Miscellaneous.

(a) **Administration.** This Agreement and the TIRZ Fund shall be administered by the City Manager or their designees or consultants. The City shall maintain a separate account for the TIRZ Fund at a depository selected by the City, which TIRZ Fund shall be secured in the manner prescribed by law for funds of Texas cities. The TIRZ Fund shall be an account into which the City shall deposit the TIRZ Increment and all accrued interest earned on the fund. The County shall participate in the oversight of the TIRZ Fund through its representation on the Board on which they will appoint two (2) out of nine (9) members. Furthermore, no more than ten percent of the County TIRZ Increment will be used for the payment of administrative, legal, consulting, or other professional expenses, except engineering and architectural fees directly related to the specific projects in which the County will participate.

(b) **Notice.** Whenever this Agreement requires or permits any consent, approval, notice, request, proposal, or demand from one party to another, the consent, approval, notice, request, proposal, or demand must be in writing to be effective and shall be delivered to the party intended to receive it at the addresses shown below (or to such other addresses as the parties may request, in writing, from time to time).

(c) **Non-Assignability.** Neither the City, the County, nor the Board shall assign any interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other parties.

(d) **Non Discrimination.** No person shall be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination in any of the operations or funding of the Zone on the grounds of race, color, national origin, age, sex, religion, or other protected status.

(e) **Binding on the Parties and Non-Waiver.** This Agreement shall not be considered fully executed or binding on the City and/or the County until this Agreement has been approved and accepted by the City Council and the Commissioners Court at a properly called and noticed meeting of each respective body. The failure of either Party to insist upon the performance of any term or provision of this Agreement or to exercise any right granted hereunder shall not constitute a waiver of that Party's right to insist upon appropriate performance or to assert any such right on any future occasion.

(f) **Third Parties.** The provisions and conditions of this Agreement are solely for the benefit for the City and the County, and are not intended to create any rights, contractual or otherwise, to any other person or entity. The relationship of the City and the County under this Agreement shall not be construed or interpreted to be a joint enterprise or joint venture. The Parties agree that each Party is an independent contractor.

(g) **Controlling Law.** Venue and jurisdiction shall be exclusively in Caldwell County, Texas and under the laws of the State of Texas.

(h) **Entirety of Agreement.** This Agreement, including any exhibits attached hereto and any documents incorporated herein by reference, contains the entire understanding and agreement between the City and the County as to the matters contained herein. Any prior or contemporaneous oral or written agreement is hereby declared null and void to the extent in conflict with any provision of this Agreement.

(i) **Amendments.** Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, this Agreement shall not be amended unless executed in writing by both parties and approved by the City Council and the Commissioners Court in open meetings held in accordance with Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code.

RULES OF PROCEDURE, CONDUCT, AND DECORUM AT MEETINGS OF THE CALDWELL COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT

- I. All Regular, Special, Emergency, and Executive Session Meetings of the Caldwell County Commissioners Court will be called and conducted in accordance with the provisions of the [Texas Open Meetings Act, Chapter 551, Government Code](#).
- II. Regular, Special, and Emergency Meetings of the Caldwell County Commissioners Court are open to the public and to representatives of the press and media. Executive Sessions of the Commissioners Court are not open to the public, the press, or the media, and only those individuals expressly requested or ordered to be present are allowed to attend Executive Sessions.
- III. The Caldwell County Commissioners Court meets in Regular Session on the second and fourth Thursdays of each month. In order for a matter or issue to appear as an agenda item on the Agenda of any Regular Meeting of the Commissioners Court, a request must be submitted with the County Judge's Office by 5:00 p.m. on the Tuesday immediately preceding the next Regular Meeting of the Commissioners Court. In addition, the agenda item request must be approved by at least one member of the Commissioners Court or the County Judge. Since these items often require review by the Commissioner or Judge it is prudent to submit requests prior to Tuesday to ensure placement on the next agenda.
 - a. The County Judge may group routine items without controversy together on the Court's Voting Session Agenda as "Consent Items," which items may be approved by the Court on a single motion and vote.
 1. Prior to consideration of the "Consent Items" the County Judge, or presiding member of the Court, will honor any request from any Court Member that an item be removed from the Consent Items and separately considered by the Court.
 2. Each Voting Session agenda item may, after discussion, be designated as "Consent," if appropriate, and included in the consent motion of the appropriate Voting Session. However, any single Court Member may prevent an item from being included in the Voting Session consent motion.
 - b. Items that are likely to be discussed in Executive Session may be grouped on the agenda with an indication under which provisions of the Texas Open Meetings Act the Executive Session will be heard.

IV. The business of Caldwell County is conducted by and between the members of the Caldwell County Commissioners Court and by those members of the county staff, elected officials, department heads, consultants, experts, and/or members of the public requested to be present and participate. While the public is invited to attend all meetings of the Commissioners Court (except Executive Sessions) the public's participation therein is limited to that of observers unless a member (or members) of the public is requested to address the Commissioners Court on a particular issue (or issues) or unless the member (or members) of the public completes a Public Participation Form and Oath of Testimony and submits same to the County Clerk before the start of the meeting. A Public Participation Form and Oath of Testimony must also be submitted in order to address the Commissioners Court on any other matter. No action will be taken during Citizens' Comments, and no discussion will be had between the speaker(s) and the members of the Court. The Court does retain the right to correct factual inaccuracies made by the speaker(s) during Citizens' Comments. A sample of the *Caldwell County Commissioners Court Public Participation Form* is attached hereto as "**Exhibit A**" and the *Oath of Testimony* is attached hereto as "**Exhibit B**."

- a. Each member of the public who appears before the Commissioners Court shall be limited to a maximum of four (4) minutes to make his/her remarks. Time for each speaker shall be maintained by the County Clerk or such other designated representative of the Commissioners Court.
- b. Maximum discussion on any agenda item shall be determined by the presiding officer using reasonable discretion in light of the circumstances at such time.
- c. In matters of exceptional interest, the Court may, by the majority vote of the members of the Court in attendance at the meeting, either shorten or lengthen the time allocated for all members of the public and/or the amount of time allocated for all agenda items and/or a specific agenda item.
- d. It is the intention of the Court to provide open access to the citizens of Caldwell County to address the Commissioners Court and express themselves on issues of County Government. Members of the public are reminded that the Caldwell County Commissioners Court is a Constitutional Court, with both judicial and legislative powers, created under *Article V, Section 1* and *Section 18* of the Texas Constitution. As a Constitutional Court, the Caldwell County Commissioners Court also possesses the power to issue a *Contempt of Court Citation* under *Section 81.023* of the Texas Local Government Code. Accordingly, members of the public in attendance at any Regular, Special, and/or Emergency Meeting of the Court shall conduct themselves with proper respect and decorum in speaking to and/or addressing the Court; in participating in public discussions before the Court; and in all actions in the presence of the Court. Proper attire for men, women, and children is mandatory. Those members of the public who are inappropriately attired and/or who do not conduct themselves in an orderly and appropriate manner will be ordered to leave the meeting.

Refusal to abide by the Court's Order and/or continued disruption of the meeting may result in a *Contempt of Court* citation.

- e. It is not the intention of the Caldwell County Commissioners Court to provide a public forum for the demeaning of any individual or group. Neither is it the intention of the Court to allow a member (or members) of the public to insult the honesty and/or integrity of the Court, as a body, or any member or members of the Court, individually or collectively. Accordingly, profane, insulting, or threatening language directed toward the Court and/or any person in the Court's presence and/or racial, ethnic, or gender slurs or epithets will not be tolerated. These Rules do not prohibit public criticism of the Commissioners Court, including criticism of any act, omission, policy, procedure, program, or service. Violation of these rules may result in the following sanctions:
 - 1. cancellation of a speaker's remaining time;
 - 2. removal from the Commissioners Courtroom;
 - 3. a Contempt Citation; and/or
 - 4. such other civil and/or criminal sanctions as may be authorized under the Constitution, Statutes, and Codes of the State of Texas.

V. All members of the Court and public are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that demonstrates respect towards others and the Court itself. Behavior that impedes or disrupts the business of the Commissioners Court while Court is in session is prohibited and unlawful pursuant to *Texas Penal Code § 42.05*. It is the intention of Caldwell County Commissioners Court to attend to County business effectively and efficiently, without undue interruption. Cell phone usage during Commissioners Court is strictly prohibited. All cell phones, pagers, and other mobile communication devices should be in "silent" mode at all times while Court is in session.

VI. The County Judge is the presiding officer of the Caldwell County Commissioners Court and is a fully participating member thereof. In the event of the absence of the County Judge, the designated Judge Pro-Tem of the Commissioners Court (appointed annually by vote of the Court) if present at the Regular, Special, Emergency Meeting, or Executive Session, shall preside. However, in the event that the Judge and Judge Pro-Tem are not present, nothing shall prevent the presiding officer from delegating this duty to another member of the Commissioners Court.

VII. The presiding officer of the Commissioners Court is responsible for conducting all meetings in accordance with these Rules of Decorum and Procedure. The presiding officer shall conduct the meeting in the following manner:

- a. When an individual member of the Commissioners Court wishes to make a motion, the presiding officer shall first recognize the individual's right to speak. The individual may then make the motion. A second is then required prior to any discussion or debate on the matter before the Court.
- b. Only after the motion and second, the presiding officer repeats the motion and opens the floor to discussion of the motion. The maker of the motion speaks first, and the presiding officer allows proponents and opponents to alternate speaking if possible. A member who has not yet spoken has precedence over those who have already voiced an opinion. The presiding officer has the authority to end discussion if it becomes too personal or too longwinded by calling for a vote.
- c. A member may only make one motion at a time (*Parliamentary Procedures* are attached hereto as **Exhibit C.**) The presiding officer may decline to allow more than three motions (one main, two secondary) on the floor at one time; for example, one substantive motion and two motions to amend. When multiple motions are on the floor, the last motion made should be the first voted on.
- d. The presiding officer at the officer's discretion but in keeping with these rules, makes procedural rulings. The body may overrule the presiding officer's procedural ruling with a motion, second, and majority vote to do so.
- e. Three members of the Court constitute a quorum unless the Court is levying taxes, in which case four members constitute a quorum or unless the Court is canvassing an election, in which case only two members of the Court constitute a quorum. If a quorum is present, the Judge shall take a vote by asking for the "ayes" and "nays". Silence shall indicate an "aye" vote. Abstentions should be stated on the record. Approval of a motion is attained by a majority vote of all the votes cast when a quorum is present. The presiding officer shall announce the result of the vote.

VIII. Special Rules for the Press and Media:

- a. No media personnel or equipment including lights, cameras, or microphones will be located on the Commissioners Court bench nor closer than five feet (5') in front of the Commissioners Court bench.
- b. Reporters and media technicians are required to structure their movements, equipment set- up, and take-down and adjustments, etc., in such a manner as to not disrupt the Commissioners Court deliberations or the ability of the public to see, hear, and participate in the proceedings.

- c. Interviews shall not be conducted inside the Commissioners Courtroom during the time the Court is in session.
- d. Media interviews which are conducted outside the Commissioners Courtroom should be conducted in such a manner that the interview does not disturb, impede, or disrupt the proceedings of any Regular, Special, Emergency, and/or Executive Session Meeting of the Court.

IX. The Sheriff of Caldwell County, Texas, or his designated deputy, shall serve as the Bailiff at all Regular, Special, and Emergency Meetings of the Court. However, in the event of the absence of the Sheriff, or in the event that there exists a conflict of interest between the Sheriff, any member of the Sheriff's Department, and the Commissioners Court, or in the event of an Executive Session of the Court in which the Sheriff is not an authorized participant, then in such event, the Court shall appoint such other commissioned peace officers to serve as Bailiff as may be necessary.


X. From time to time, the Commissioners Court shall conduct town meetings and public hearings. These Rules of Procedure, Conduct, and Decorum shall also apply to such town meetings and public hearings; however, the Commissioners Court may adopt such additional and supplemental rules for such meetings as may be necessary and appropriate to conduct such meetings in an orderly, efficient, and proper manner.

XI. These Rules of Procedure, Conduct, and Decorum at Meetings of the Caldwell County Commissioners Court shall be effective immediately upon adoption by the Court and shall remain in full force and effect until amended or repealed by a majority vote of the Commissioners Court.





EXHIBIT C

PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURES

Motions

Any member of Commissioners Court during the addressing or discussion of an action Agenda Item may “move that some type of action or inaction be taken by the Court” and another member of the Court would need to “second” the motion before it could be debated and voted upon. While a motion is on the floor and being debated, any member of Commissioners Court may make the following motions:

I. Primary Motions

- a. **Motion to Amend** – “Move that the original motion be amended” (to add new wording) and another member of the Court would need to “second” the amendment before it could be debated and voted upon. The vote would be on the amendment first. If the amendment passed, then a vote on the original motion with the amended wording would be in order. If the amendment failed, then a vote on the original motion with original wording would be in order. No more than one amendment may be on the floor at any one time.
- b. **Recommend New Wording or Friendly Amendment** – Recommend a change in the wording of the original motion and if the member of the Court who moved the original motion and the member of the Court who seconded the original motion agrees then the original motion is changed or corrected. Debate and voting would continue without any minutes, record, or mention of the original wording.
- c. **Motion to Postpone** – Move to postpone any Agenda Item to a later point in time in the current meeting. This motion needs a “second”.
- d. This motion is not debatable; however, each member of the Court may quickly express their thoughts within a few seconds.
- e. **Motion to Table** – “Move to table to a date certain or if no date is given then the table will be indefinitely. This motion needs a second and is debatable before a vote is taken.
- f. **Call the Question** – Call “question” which means that member of Court is ready to vote. This statement does not require any action. It is only a readiness to vote signal.

- g. **Motion to End Debate** – “Move the question” is an action motion to stop debate and it does need a “second” from another member of the Court. This motion once seconded is not debatable. A vote must be immediate and if it passes then debate will cease and then the original motion or amendment must be voted upon. If the “move the question” motion fails, then debate will continue.

II. Supplemental Motions

- a. **Motion to Refer** – “Move to refer the Agenda Item to staff or legal counsel” for further research, information, or review may be used often in Commissioners Court. This motion or amendment requires a “second” and may be debated before a vote is taken. This motion or amendment would be handled just like a regular action motion or amendment as described above. A successful motion to refer will be placed on a future Agenda once the research and/or review is completed.
- b. **Motion to Reconsider** – This motion may be made at any time during a meeting to reconsider an Agenda Item already approved or disallowed earlier in the agenda.
- c. **Motion to Adjourn** – “Move to adjourn” is a motion that may be made when an Agenda Item is not being addressed. This motion requires a “second” and may be debated before a vote is taken.

Agenda Order: The presiding officer may take Agenda Items out of order to accommodate agenda speakers and requests from the Commissioners Court. No vote or further authority is needed, however once an Agenda Item is addressed, it must be concluded.

Recess: The presiding officer may recess the meeting for up to two (2) hours without a motion or a vote. For Commissioners Court to recess for more than two (2) hours a “move to recess until a specific time” is required along with a “second.” This motion may be debated before a vote is called. The maximum extension of any recess shall be only until a specific time, the very next day. This recess order or motion would normally be acceptable only when an agenda item is not being addressed. However, if the Court needs to leave the Courtroom to physically view an agenda item for better understanding, then it would be acceptable.

Sec. 81.005. TERMS OF COURT, MEETINGS.

(a) At the last regular term of each fiscal year of the county, the commissioners court by order shall designate a day of the week on which the court shall convene in a regular term each month during the next fiscal year. If the completion of the court's business does not require a monthly term, the court need not hold more than one term a quarter. A regular term may continue for one week but may be adjourned earlier if the court's business is completed.

(b) The county judge or three county commissioners may call a special term of the court. A special term may continue until the court's business is completed. A special term may be held at a meeting place located in the county and outside the county seat if:

(1) the commissioners court agrees to meet in that location; and

(2) the meeting place is in a building providing public access that can accommodate the number of persons expected to attend the meeting.

(c) Except as provided by Subsections (b) and (f) of this section, the term shall be held at:

(1) the county seat at the courthouse;

(2) an auxiliary courthouse, courthouse annex, or another building in the county acquired by the county under Chapter 292, 293, or 305 or another law, that houses county administration offices or county or district courts, located inside the municipal limits of the county seat;

(3) the regular meeting place of another political subdivision if:

(A) the commissioners court meets with the governing body of that political subdivision located wholly or partly within the county; and

(B) the regular meeting place of that political subdivision is in the county;

(4) a meeting place in the county in a building owned by another political subdivision located wholly or partly in the county if:

(A) the commissioners court meets with the governing body of that political subdivision;

(B) the places where the commissioners court and the governing body of the political subdivision regularly hold their meetings are not large enough to accommodate the number of persons expected to attend the meeting; and

(C) the meeting place in the building owned by the political subdivision is large enough to accommodate the expected number of persons; or

(5) a meeting place in the county in a building owned by the county if:

(A) the place where the commissioners court regularly holds its meetings is not large enough to accommodate the number of persons expected to attend the meeting; and

(B) the meeting place in the building owned by the county is large enough to accommodate the expected number of persons.

(d) At the first regular term of each calendar year, the commissioners court may select, on no less than seven days notice, a new site at which terms are to be held during that year pursuant to Subsection (c) (2).

(e) On initial enactment of this legislation the county commissioners court may select a new site pursuant to Subsection (c) (2) on seven days notice and passage at a regular meeting of commissioners court.

(f) If the commissioners court determines that in the interest of public safety the term should be held at a site other than the site selected under Subsection (d), the commissioners court may, after notice, hold a term at a different site as determined by the commissioners court.

(g) Any business of the commissioners court that is required by law to be conducted at a regular term may also be conducted at any meeting of the court held on a day on which the court routinely and periodically meets, regardless of whether the periodic interval is weekly, monthly, quarterly, annually, or some other interval.

(h) The commissioners court may designate a day of the week on which the court shall convene in a regular term each month other than the day of the week designated under Subsection (a).



**CALDWELL COUNTY, TEXAS
DECLARATION OF LOCAL DISASTER
PROHIBITION OF OUTDOOR BURNING**

WHEREAS, Section §418.108 of the Local Government Code provides that the County Judge can declare a slate of Local Disaster within the county) and order, may prohibit outdoor burning in the unincorporated area of the county when he finds that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning and,

WHEREAS, the County Judge does find that circumstances present in all of the unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that could be exacerbated by outdoor burning;

BE IT THEREFORE ORDERED, that the following emergency regulations are hereby established for all unincorporated areas of Caldwell County, Texas that are not subject to public ownership or stewardship for the duration of the above mentioned declaration:

- I. Action Prohibited:
 - (a) A person violates this order if he/she burns a combustible material outside of an enclosure, which serves to contain all flame and/or sparks, or orders such burning by others.
 - (b) A person violates this order if he /she engages in any activity outdoors which could allow flames or sparks that could result in a fire, unless done in an enclosure designed to protect the spread of fire, or orders such activities by others.
2. Enforcement:
 - (a) Upon notification of suspected outdoor burning the fire department assigned shall respond to the scene and take immediate measures to contain or extinguish the fire.
 - (b) If requested by a fire official, a duly commissioned peace officer, when available, shall be notified and sent to the scene to investigate the nature of the fire.
 - (c) If, in the opinion of the officer investigating and the fire official, the goal of this order can be obtained by informing the responsible party about the prohibitions established by this order the officer may at his discretion notify the party about the provisions of this order and request compliance with it, or issue a citation for: **Violation of Burn Ban Order**.
3. This Order does not prohibit prescribed fire(s) conducted in compliance with guidelines set forth by federal or state natural resource agencies and conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Section 153.048 Natural Resources Code, and meets the standards of Section 153.047, Natural Resources Code, burned under a burn plan approved by such agencies, or outdoor burning activities related to public health and

safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for:

- (a) Firefighter training
- (b) Public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations
- (c) Planting or harvesting of agricultural crops

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that an exemption be hereby granted for a bona fide commercial land clearing business, allowing said business to burn as long as all other provisions of the Order and applicable laws and ordinances are adhered to as set forth herein, and contact is made and the burning approved by the Caldwell County Emergency Management Coordinator at 1403 Blackjack St. Lockhart, TX at phone Number 512-398-1822, and receiving permission, prior to any outdoor burning.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that an exemption be hereby granted to those businesses where welding is an essential function of the business, allowing welding operations to proceed as long as the area of welding operations has been cleared of vegetation for a distance of no less than ten (10) feet in all directions, that there be a second capable person acting as a fire spotter with a sufficient water source available to extinguish fires which may be ignited from stray sparks, and only when all other provisions of the Order and applicable laws and ordinances are adhered to as set forth herein.

BE IT ALSO ORDERED, that the purpose of this order is the mitigation of the hazard posed by wildfire during the term of the dry, weather by curtailing outdoor burning; which purpose is to be taken into account in any enforcement action based upon this order.

This order will remain in effect for a period of 14 days, and shall expire at the end of said period.

**GRANT AGREEMENT
BETWEEN THE

RECITALS

Senate Bill 3, 89th Tex. Leg., 2nd C.S., codified as Texas Government Code § 418.027 and Texas Water Code, Chapter 16, Subchapter M, established a grant program for the installation of outdoor warning sirens in flash flood-prone areas to be administered by the Office of the Governor. Senate Bill 5, 89th Tex. Leg., 2nd C.S., appropriated \$50,000,000 to the Office of the Governor for that grant program.

On November 6, 2025, the Office of the Governor delegated that grant program and the associated appropriation to the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB).

On December 16, 2025, TWDB authorized the Executive Administrator to enter into grant agreements to distribute funds in the form of umbrella grants to counties in flash flood-prone areas, as defined in Texas Water Code § 16.501, including Caldwell County, for the purpose of installing outdoor warning sirens in flash flood-prone areas. A copy of that action is attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.

The TWDB and Caldwell County, Texas, sometimes hereinafter called "County," are the Parties to this Agreement.

THEREFORE, the Parties mutually agree to adhere to the terms of this Agreement and to administer the Grant Funds provided through this Agreement in conformance with all applicable state and federal laws and regulations and all terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.

ARTICLE I. DEFINITIONS

The following terms, as used in this Agreement, have the meanings assigned below:

Agreement or Grant Agreement means this agreement and the attached exhibits.

Eligible Expenses means the expenses authorized by the Legislation and the forthcoming TWDB guidance and best management practices.

Executive Administrator means the Executive Administrator of the TWDB or a designated representative.

Flash Flood-Prone area means an area of this state included in the disaster declaration issued by the governor under Texas Government Code § 418.014, in response to the July 2025 Hill Country floods, as set forth in Texas Water Code § 16.501(1).

Grant Funds means the appropriated funds that the TWDB committed in an initial amount not to exceed \$1,000,000 to finance the Project(s) for the County.

Legislation means Senate Bill 3, 89th Leg., 2nd C.S., 2025.

Outdoor warning siren means a system that produces a sound designed to alert a person who is outdoors of an imminent disaster and encourage that person to immediately shelter or move to higher ground and includes sensors, gauges, and all other components essential to the function of the system, as set forth in Texas Water Code § 16.501(2).

Parties or Party means the TWDB and the County, collectively or individually as implied by the context, and their authorized successors and assignees.

Progress Report means the TWDB approved form for periodically reporting eligible expenses.

Project means the activities to install one or more outdoor warning sirens described in the County's forthcoming Project Plan(s), as approved by TWDB.

Project Plan means a statement of work and task and expense budget for each discrete Project the County intends to conduct.

State means the State of Texas.

Surplus Funds means those funds remaining after the County has submitted a final accounting to the Executive Administrator.

TWDB means the Texas Water Development Board.

ARTICLE II. AUTHORITY AND REPRESENTATIONS

2.1. AUTHORITY. This Agreement is authorized and required by the Legislation and **Exhibit A.**

2.2. REPRESENTATIONS. The Parties agree that the following representations are true and correct and form the basis of this Agreement:

A. The County is eligible for financial assistance and qualifies for the grant. The TWDB may provide financial assistance for Eligible Expenses up to an initial amount of \$1,000,000. The TWDB may reduce the amount of financial assistance available under

this Agreement if the County fails to submit approvable Project Plans for the full \$1,000,000 initial amount awarded under this Agreement by December 31, 2026.

B. The TWDB and the County enter this Agreement to set forth the terms and conditions for the Grant Funds. The Executive Administrator is authorized to execute this Agreement on behalf of the TWDB through the December 16, 2025, Board item, attached as **Exhibit A**. The County is authorized to execute this Agreement through its authorized representative designated by resolution duly adopted by the governing body of the County and provided to TWDB.

ARTICLE III. LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

3.1. APPLICABLE LAWS. In consideration of the performance of the mutual agreements set forth in this Agreement, the County, by and through its authorized representatives, agrees to complete the Project in compliance with all federal and state laws, rules, and regulations applicable to the Project.

3.2. PROCUREMENT. The County must comply with State and local procurement and contracting laws.

3.3. IRON AND STEEL. Unless a waiver is granted, the County must abide by all applicable construction contract requirements related to the use of iron and steel products and manufactured goods produced in the United States, as required by Texas Government Code § 2252.202.

3.4. FOREIGN TERRORIST ORGANIZATION. The County certifies that it will not enter into a contract with any contractor or subcontractor that is engaged in business with Iran, Sudan, or a foreign terrorist organization, as prohibited by Texas Government Code § 2252.152.

3.5. LOBBYING PROHIBITION. The County represents and warrants that TWDB's payments to the County and the County's receipt of appropriated or other funds under this Grant Agreement are not prohibited by Texas Government Code §§ 556.005 or 556.0055, related to the prohibition on payment of state funds to a lobbyist or for lobbying activities.

ARTICLE IV. SPECIAL COVENANTS AND REPRESENTATIONS

4.1. CONDITIONS FOR DISBURSEMENT OF GRANT FUNDS. The process to approve disbursement of grant funds will be as follows:

- A. The County will submit a Project Plan for each discrete Project the County intends to conduct for review and approval by the Executive Administrator;
- B. Each Project Plan will include only activities in Flash Flood-Prone areas TWDB has found to have a history of consistent or severe flooding such that the installation,

maintenance, and operation of one or more outdoor warning sirens is warranted, in accordance with Texas Water Code § 16.502(a);

- C. The Executive Administrator will review submitted Project Plans for compliance with this Grant Agreement and all applicable laws, rules, regulations and guidance, including the forthcoming TWDB guidance and best management practices for outdoor warning sirens under Texas Water Code § 16.502(h).
- D. The Executive Administrator will either provide a letter of approval or request changes to a Project Plan.
- E. When a Project Plan is approved, TWDB will provide the County an initial advance of 25% of the approved budget for the Project Plan.
- F. The County will submit Progress Reports, along with documentation for its expenditure of grant funds, to the TWDB monthly. Progress reports must use the task and expense budgets included in **Exhibit B**. The Executive Administrator may adjust the amount of submitted expenses to be reconciled against outstanding advanced balances or adjust the amount of funds to be released based on the TWDB's review of the Progress Reports and the projected needs for the Project .
- G. TWDB will provide additional advances, each equal to 25% of the budget for the approved Project Plan, after reconciliation of at least 50% of the outstanding balance for previous advances.

4.2. DELIVERY OF GRANT FUNDS. The TWDB will deposit the Grant Funds in an interest-bearing account subject to Public Funds Collateral Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 2257.

4.3. FINAL REPORT. The County must submit a final report to the TWDB that must include, at a minimum, the following:

- A. Communities and/or entities involved in formulating the Project;
- B. Types of equipment installed or proposed equipment (if applicable);
- C. Location(s) of equipment placement or proposed equipment (if applicable); and
- D. Summary of how the project satisfies requirements laid out in the TWDB guidance and best management practices for outdoor warning sirens published by the TWDB.

4.4. FINAL ACCOUNTING. The County must provide a final accounting of funds at the completion of the Project.

4.5. INVESTMENT AND COLLATERALIZATION OF PUBLIC FUNDS. Grant proceeds are public funds and, as such, these proceeds must be held at a designated state depository

institution or other properly chartered and authorized institution in accordance with the Public Funds Investment Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 2256, and the Public Funds Collateral Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 2257.

4.6. ASSURANCES RELATED TO STATE FUNDS.

- A. The County certifies that it is not prohibited from receiving state funds under Texas Penal Code § 1.10(d) (related to federal laws regulating firearms, firearm accessories, and firearm ammunition). The County also agrees that, during the term of this Agreement, the County will immediately notify TWDB, in writing, of any suit against it by the Attorney General of Texas under Texas Penal Code § 1.10(f).
- B. The County certifies that it is not prohibited from receiving state grant funds under Texas Government Code § 2.103 (related to the regulation of firearm suppressors). The County also agrees that, during the term of this Agreement, the County will immediately notify TWDB, in writing, of any suit against it by the Attorney General of Texas under Texas Government Code § 2.104.
- C. The County certifies that it is not prohibited from receiving state grant funds under Texas Local Government Code § 364.004 (related to public camping bans). The County also agrees that, during the term of this Agreement, the County will immediately notify TWDB, in writing, of any suit against it by the Attorney General of Texas under Texas Local Government Code § 364.003.

4.7. AGREEMENT FOR INSTALLATION, MAINTENANCE, AND OPERATION. If a Project Plan includes activities within a municipality, the County will make a written agreement with the municipality to jointly install, maintain, or operate one or more outdoor warning sirens OR subcontract with the municipality for installation, maintenance, and operation of the outdoor warning sirens. Additionally, the County may by written agreement jointly install, maintain, or operate an outdoor warning siren with municipalities, counties, and other governmental entities.

ARTICLE V. TERMINATION AND REMEDIES

5.1. TERMINATION. The TWDB may terminate this Agreement in writing at any time. Upon receipt of a notice of termination, the County must immediately discontinue all work in connection with the performance of this Agreement and must promptly cancel all existing orders or other financial commitments chargeable to funding provided under this Agreement provided, however, that any costs for Eligible Expenses incurred before the receipt of such written notice by the County must be payable from the funding provided under this Agreement.

Within thirty (30) days of the notice of termination, the County must submit a statement showing in detail the work performed, all payments received by the County, and all payments made by or due from the County to any contractor before the date of termination.

ARTICLE VI. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

6.1. **INDEMNIFICATION.**

- A. The County is an independent contractor and, therefore, is solely responsible for liability resulting from acts or omissions of the County, its employees, contractors, or agents. Nothing in this Agreement will be construed as consent by the State of Texas, the TWDB, or any state agency or entity as consent to be sued in any matter arising out of this Agreement.
- B. Grant Funds must not be used by the County when sampling, testing, removing, or disposing of contaminated soils and/or media at the project site. The County agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and protect the TWDB from any and all claims, causes of action or damages to the person or property of third parties arising from the sampling, analysis, transport, storage, treatment and disposition of any contaminated sewage sludge, contaminated sediments and/or contaminated media that may be generated by the County, its contractors, consultants, agents, officials and employees as a result of activities relating to the Project to the extent permitted by law.
- C. To the extent allowed by law, the County releases the TWDB, its officers, employees and agents, and the members of its governing body from any and all liability, cost, expense, damage, or loss of whatever nature directly or indirectly resulting from, arising out of, in connection with, or related to activities under this Agreement. Any defense must be coordinated by the County with the office of the Texas Attorney General when Texas state agencies are named defendants in any lawsuit, and respondent may not agree to any settlement without first obtaining the concurrence from the Office of the Texas Attorney General. The County and TWDB agree to furnish timely written notice to each other of any such claim.

6.2. **PERMITS.** The County is responsible for timely filing applications for all licenses, permits, registrations, and other authorizations the County has identified as required for the County to complete the Project.

6.3. **RECORDS.** The County must comply with all terms and conditions relating to records for this Agreement.

- A. **Duty to Maintain Records.** The County must maintain financial accounting records relating to the Agreement in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. The County must also require its contractors to maintain financial accounting records consistent with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles and with State laws applicable to government accounting. All accounting and other financial documentation must be accurate, current, and reflect recordation of the transactions at or about the time the transactions occurred.

B. Duty to Retain Records. The County must retain all financial records and supporting documents and any other documents pertinent to the Agreement in accordance with the requirements of applicable State law relating to retention and access to records. The County must retain all records related to this Agreement for a period of three (3) years after Agreement completion.

C. Public Information Act. The County understands that TWDB will comply with the Texas Public Information Act, Texas Government Code Chapter 552, as interpreted by judicial rulings and opinions of the Attorney General of the State of Texas. Information, documentation, and other material in connection with this Agreement may be subject to public disclosure pursuant to the Texas Public Information Act. In accordance with Texas Government Code § 2252.907, the County is required to make any information created or exchanged with the State pursuant to this Agreement and not otherwise excepted from disclosure under the Texas Public Information Act available in a format that is accessible by the public at no additional charge to the State.

D. Access to Records.

1. State Auditor's Right to Audit. The state auditor may conduct an audit or investigation of any entity receiving funds from the state directly under the Agreement or indirectly through a subcontract under the Agreement. The acceptance of funds directly under the Agreement or indirectly through a subcontract under the Agreement acts as acceptance of the authority of the state auditor, under the direction of the legislative audit committee, to conduct an audit or investigation in connection with those funds. Under the direction of the legislative audit committee, an entity that is the subject of an audit or investigation by the state auditor must provide the state auditor with access to any information the state auditor considers relevant to the investigation or audit. The County also agrees to include a provision in any contract or subcontract related to this Agreement that requires the contractor and the subcontractor to submit to audits and investigations by the Texas State Auditor's Office in connection with all Grant Funds received under the contract or subcontract.
2. TWDB. The County agrees that the standards of administration, property management, audit procedures, procurement, and financial management, and the records and facilities of the County and its contractors are subject to audit and inspection by the TWDB and by any other authorized state or federal entity. All books, documents, papers, and records of the County related to this Agreement must be made available for audit, examination, excerpt, and transcription by the TWDB within a reasonable time after a request from the TWDB.

6.4 STANDARDS OF PERFORMANCE.

- A. **Personnel.** The County must assign only qualified personnel to perform the services required under this Agreement. The County is responsible for ensuring that any Subcontractor utilized also assigns only qualified personnel. Qualified personnel are persons who are properly licensed to perform the work and who have sufficient knowledge, skill, and ability to perform the tasks and services required herein according to the standards of performance and care for their trade or profession.
- B. **Professional Standards.** The County must provide the services and deliverables in accordance with applicable professional standards. The County represents and warrants that it is authorized to acquire Subcontractors with the requisite qualifications, experience, personnel, and other resources to perform in the manner required by this Agreement.
- C. **Independent Contractor.** Both the County and TWDB, in the performance of this Agreement, act in an individual capacity and not as agents, employees, partners, joint ventures or associates of one another. The employees or agents of one party will not be deemed or construed to be the employees or agents of the other party for any purposes whatsoever.
- D. **Proprietary and Confidential Information.** The County represents and warrants that any information that is proprietary or confidential and is received by the County from TWDB or any governmental entity will not be disclosed to third parties without the written consent of TWDB or applicable governmental entity, whose consent will not be unreasonably withheld.
- E. **Agreement Administration.** TWDB will designate a project manager for this Agreement. The project manager will serve as the point of contact between TWDB and the County. TWDB's project manager will supervise TWDB's review of the County's technical work, deliverables, payment requests, schedules, financial and budget administration, and similar matters. The project manager does not have any express or implied authority to vary the terms of the Agreement, amend the Agreement in any way, or waive strict performance of the terms or conditions of the Agreement.
- F. **Nepotism.** The County must comply with Texas Government Code Chapter 573 by ensuring that no officer, employee or member of the County's governing body votes or confirms the employment of any person related within the second degree of affinity or the third degree of consanguinity to any member of the governing body or to any other officer or employee authorized to employ or supervise such person. This prohibition does not prohibit the employment of a person who has been continuously employed for a period of two years prior to the election or appointment of the officer, employee or governing body member related to such person in the prohibited degree.
- G. **Open Meetings.** The County must comply with Texas Government Code Chapter 551,

which requires all regular, special, or called meetings of governmental bodies to be open to the public, except as otherwise provided by law.

6.5. AFFIRMATIONS AND CERTIFICATIONS.

- A. **Antitrust Affirmation.** The County represents and warrants that, in accordance with Texas Government Code § 2155.005, neither the County nor any firm, corporation, partnership, or institution represented by the County, or anyone acting for such a firm, corporation, partnership, or institution has (1) violated any provision of the Texas Free Enterprise and Antitrust Act of 1983, Chapter 15 of the Texas Business & Commerce Code, or the federal antitrust laws; or (2) communicated directly or indirectly the contents of the proposal resulting in this Agreement to any competitor or any other person engaged in the same line of business as the County.
- B. **Child Support Obligation Affirmation.** Under Texas Family Code § 231.006, the County certifies that the individual or business entity named in this Agreement is not ineligible to receive the specified grant, loan or payment, and acknowledges that this Agreement may be terminated and payment may be withheld if this certification is inaccurate.
- C. **Dealings with Public Servants.** Pursuant to Texas Government Code § 2155.003, the County represents and warrants that it has not given, offered to give, nor intends to give at any time hereafter any economic opportunity, future employment, gift, loan, gratuity, special discount, trip, favor, or service to a public servant in connection with the goods or services being supplied.
- D. **Debts and Delinquencies Affirmation.** The County agrees that any payments due under the Agreement will be applied towards any debt or delinquency that is owed to the State of Texas.
- E. **E-Verify Program.** The County certifies that for contracts for services, the County will utilize the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system during the term of the Agreement to determine the eligibility of: (1) all persons employed by the County to perform duties within Texas; and (2) all persons, including Subcontractors, assigned by the County to perform work pursuant to the Agreement within the United States of America.
- F. **Entities that Boycott Israel.** Pursuant to Texas Government Code § 2270.002, the County certifies that either (1) it meets one of the exemption criteria under § 2270.002; or (2) it does not boycott Israel and will not boycott Israel during the term of the Agreement resulting from this solicitation. The County must state any facts that make it exempt from the boycott certification.
- G. **Excluded Parties.** The County certifies that it is not listed on the federal government's terrorism watch list as described in Executive Order 13224.

H. Executive Head of a State Agency Affirmation. In accordance with Texas Government Code § 669.003, relating to contracting with the executive head of a state agency, the County certifies that it is not: (1) the executive head of TWDB; (2) a person who at any time during the four years before the date of this Agreement was the executive head of TWDB; or (3) a person who employs a current or former executive head of TWDB.

If § 669.003 applies, the County must provide the following information:

I. Financial Participation Prohibited. Pursuant to Texas Government Code § 2155.004(a), the County certifies that neither the County nor any person or entity represented by the County has received compensation from TWDB or any agency of the State of Texas for participation in the preparation of the specifications or solicitation on which this Agreement is based. Under Texas Government Code § 2155.004(b), the County certifies that the individual or business entity named in this Agreement is not ineligible to receive the specified Agreement and acknowledges that this Agreement may be terminated and payment withheld if this certification is inaccurate.

J. Foreign Terrorist Organizations. The County represents and warrants that it is not engaged in business with Iran, Sudan, or a foreign terrorist organization, as prohibited by Texas Government Code § 2252.152.

K. Human Trafficking Prohibition. Under Texas Government Code § 2155.0061, the County certifies that the County is not ineligible to receive the specified Agreement and acknowledges that this Agreement may be terminated and payment withheld if this certification is inaccurate.

L. No Conflict of Interest. The County represents and warrants that the provision of goods and services or other performance under this Agreement will not constitute an actual or potential conflict of interest or reasonably create an appearance of impropriety. The County also represents and warrants that, during the term of this Agreement, the County will immediately notify TWDB, in writing, of any existing or potential conflict of interest relative to the performance of the Agreement.

M. Prior Disaster Relief Declaration. Texas Government Code §§ 2155.006 and 2261.053 prohibit state agencies from accepting a response or awarding a contract that includes proposed financial participation by a person who, in the past five years, has been convicted of violating a federal law or assessed a penalty in connection with a contract involving relief for Hurricane Rita, Hurricane Katrina, or any other disaster, as defined by Texas Government Code § 418.004, occurring after September 24, 2005.

Under Texas Government Code §§ 2155.006 and 2261.053, the County certifies that the individual or business entity named in this GRANT AGREEMENT is not ineligible to receive the specified Agreement and acknowledges that this Agreement may be terminated and payment withheld if this certification is inaccurate.

N. **Suspension and Debarment.** The County certifies that it and its principals are not suspended or debarred from doing business with the state or federal government as listed on the State of Texas Debarred Vendor List maintained by the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts and the System for Award Management (SAM) maintained by the General Services Administration.

6.6. UPDATING INFORMATION. The County must provide the TWDB with updated information, reports, statements, and certifications as requested by the Executive Administrator relating to the financial condition of the County or the Project and the use of Grant Funds. The County must promptly notify the TWDB of any material change in the activities, prospects, or conditions of the County relating to the Project, or its ability to perform its duties, covenants, and agreements under this Grant Agreement.

6.7. FORCE MAJEURE. Unless otherwise provided, neither the County nor the TWDB nor any agency of the State shall be liable to the other for any delay in or failure of performance of a requirement contained in this Agreement caused by *Force Majeure*. The existence of such causes of delay or failure shall extend the period of performance until after the causes of delay or failure have been removed provided the non-performing Party exercises all reasonable due diligence to perform. Each Party must inform the other in writing with proof of receipt within five (5) business days of the existence of such *Force Majeure* or otherwise waive this right as a defense.

6.8. NON-ASSIGNABILITY. The terms and conditions of the financial assistance provided by this Agreement may not be assigned or transferred, in any manner, without the express written consent of the TWDB.

6.9. ENTIRE AGREEMENT AND AMENDMENT. This Agreement, which incorporates all attached Exhibits, constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties. This Agreement may be amended only in writing signed by the Parties.

6.10. NO WAIVER. The failure of any Party to insist upon the strict performance of any of the terms, provisions, or conditions of this Agreement will not be construed as a waiver or relinquishment for the future of the strict performance of any term, provision, or condition of this Agreement or any other applicable term, provision, or condition.

6.11. GOVERNING LAW AND VENUE. This Agreement is governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, without regard to the conflicts of law provisions. The venue of any suit arising under this Agreement is fixed in any court of competent jurisdiction in Travis County, Texas, unless the specific venue is otherwise identified in a statute which directly names or otherwise identifies its applicability to TWDB.

6.12. NOTICES. All notices, notifications, or requests required or permitted by this Agreement must be in writing and must be transmitted by personal delivery or transmitted by United States certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, to the addresses of the Parties shown below. Notice will be effective when received by the Party to whom notice is sent.

ACTION REQUESTED

Consider authorizing the Executive Administrator to negotiate and execute contracts for SB 3 Outdoor Warning Siren Grants.

BACKGROUND

During the second called session of the 89th Texas Legislature, the legislature passed Senate Bill (SB) 3 relating to outdoor warning sirens in flash flood-prone areas in response to the devastating July 2025 flooding in Texas. The bill requires the Office of the Governor (OOG) to establish and administer a grant program to assist municipalities, counties, and other governmental entities with the costs of installing outdoor warning sirens. In November 2025, the OOG delegated this responsibility to the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB).

Additionally, SB 5, passed by the 89th Texas Legislature in the second called session, appropriated \$50 million from the economic stabilization fund to the OOG for the two-year period beginning September 18, 2025 (the effective date of the bill). Funding is for grants to assist counties, municipalities, or other local governments operating within certain counties (as provided by the governor's declaration of disaster on July 4, 2025) to install outdoor warning siren systems, including flood gages and all other components essential to the function of the system. In the November 2025 delegation of the grant program to TWDB, the OOG also agreed to transfer this money to the TWDB for that grant program. A portion of the \$50 million will be used to support TWDB's administration of the program.

KEY ISSUES

The Executive Administrator recommends apportioning this funding to each county included in the Governor's July 2025 Disaster Declaration to implement the requirements of SB 3 in a timely manner. The Executive Administrator would enter into a grant agreement with each county for a maximum of \$1 million with an allowance to increase that amount by \$250,000; any additional increases would require approval by the Board. After executing the grant agreement, each county would submit a project plan, including scope of work and budget, for each discrete project the county intends to conduct for review and approval by the TWDB Executive Administrator. The county could work with municipalities and other governmental entities to install the required outdoor warning sirens, in accordance with Texas Water Code § 16.502. The county and any other appropriate local government would work to determine the necessary projects and project sponsors.

Through the grant agreements, the TWDB would allow for advances of funds.

At the outset of this grant program, each county would agree that all projects will be located in areas that are flash flood-prone with a history of consistent or severe flooding, in accordance with Texas Water Code § 16.502. The TWDB will continue working with our assigned contractor in identifying flash flood-prone areas throughout the disaster declaration areas that have a history of consistent or severe flooding. This continued work will be used to identify flash flood-prone areas.

Key considerations for the applicable counties:

- Each county will be required to submit a resolution from the Commissioner's Court authorizing acceptance of the money and approval to enter into a grant agreement.
- If a county must work with another local governmental entity for the installation of the outdoor warning siren, this must be done through a written agreement (Texas Water Code § 16.502).
- The grant agreement will allow for a certain level of advance payments and then the county will be required to submit documentation to establish eligible costs. This will be done through periodic reporting.

RECOMMENDATION

The Executive Administrator recommends authorizing the Executive Administrator to negotiate and execute grant agreements with the following counties to implement the SB 3 Outdoor Warning Siren Grant Program: Bandera, Bexar, Burnet, Caldwell, Coke, Comal, Concho, Edwards, Gillespie, Guadalupe, Hamilton, Kendall, Kerr, Kimble, Kinney, Lampasas, Llano, Mason, Maverick, McCulloch, Menard, Real, Reeves, San Saba, Schleicher, Sutton, Tom Green, Travis, Uvalde, and Williamson counties.




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Summary

Texas' Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) is a federally funded law enforcement grant program run by the Traffic Safety Division at the Texas Department of Transportation. The goal of the STEP program is for TxDOT to develop partnerships with law enforcement to reduce crashes by creating safer driving environments on Texas roadways through high-visibility enforcement (HVE).

STEP grants provide federal funding for overtime enforcement activities conducted by Texas law enforcement agencies. Organizations eligible for STEP funds include the Texas Department of Public Safety (TxDPS), sheriff's offices, constable's offices, and local police departments.

In accordance with 43 TAC §25.901, et seq., the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is requesting project proposals to support the targets and strategies of its Traffic Safety Program to reduce the number of motor vehicle related crashes, fatalities, and serious injuries in Texas.

The Texas Department of Transportation, in accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (78 Stat. 252, 42 U.S.C 2000d to 2000d-4) and the Regulations, hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded full and fair opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in consideration for an award.

Proposals submitted through this RFP will be reviewed for inclusion in the FY 2027 Annual Grant Application (AGA), which will be submitted to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) for approval and funding. The FY 2027 grant period is from October 1, 2026, through September 30, 2027.

Note: *Click-It-Or-Ticket*, *Operation: Slowdown* and *Impaired Driving Mobilization* proposals will be accepted through a separate process. For more information, contact eGrants Help at TRF_eGrantsHelp@txdot.gov.

Funding

Authority and Responsibility for funding of the traffic safety grant program derives from the National Highway Safety Act (23 USC §401, et seq.), and the Texas Traffic Safety Act (Transportation Code, Chapter 723). The Behavioral Traffic Safety Section (TRF-BTS) provides oversight of statewide projects and local projects at the agency's 25 districts. TRF-BTS administers the program within the Traffic Safety Division (TRF) of TxDOT.

The Texas Traffic Safety Program is funded with federal funds allocated from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) with Section 402 - State and Community Highway Safety Programs and Section 405 - National Priority Safety Programs (i.e., Occupant Protection, Impaired Driving Countermeasures, Motorcyclist Safety, and Nonmotorized Safety, among others).

STEP agency funding amounts are based on the number of enforcement hours the agency reasonably expects to work over the course of a full year. TxDOT may negotiate or amend a proposal's budget prior to execution.

All proposers are required to contribute 15% of the total budget in approved match.

Funding Constraints

- Funds are authorized on a federal fiscal year basis only. Awarded grants are contingent upon the availability of federal funds.
- Projects included in the AGA become cost reimbursable grant in-aid agreements.
- Federal and state grant funds cannot be used for lobbying.

- Supplanting is prohibited. Supplanting is defined as the “Use of federal funds to support personnel or an activity that is already supported (paid for) by local or state funds.”

Grant Types

STEP-Comprehensive (COMP) Grants

A STEP-COMP grant focuses enforcement efforts on reducing intersection-related violations, driving while intoxicated, failure to use occupant restraint systems, enforcement of state and local ordinances on cellular and texting devices and unsafe speed within the high-crash areas they identify, although any traffic-related probable cause may be used to initiate a vehicle stop.

STEP-Commercial Motor Vehicle (CMV) Grants

Law enforcement agencies may also request a STEP-CMV grant. Officers do not need to be specially certified to participate in STEP-CMV enforcement.

Federal inspections are not allowable on STEP projects. Officers conducting enforcement on a STEP-CMV grant must focus on state-level traffic violations, violations of local ordinances committed by CMVs, and on passenger vehicles whose unlawful actions such as improper lane changes which clearly cause a CMV to take evasive action or undertake hard-braking events.

STEP-COMP and STEP-CMV – Holiday Period Prioritization

STEP-COMP and CMV subgrantee agencies should prioritize enforcement activities during state and federally determined holiday periods, which occur during the months listed in parenthesis:

- Christmas-New Year’s (Dec-Jan 1)
- Spring Break (March)
- Memorial Day (May-June)
- Independence Day (June-July)
- Operation: Slowdown (July)
- Labor Day (August)

STEP Project Operational Requirements

The following items are requirements for both STEP-COMP and STEP-CMV grants:

- All enforcement activities must be initiated within, or in route to an established Enforcement Zone as outlined in the grant's Operational Plan.
- Agencies will document and report the numbers of warnings, citations and arrests made on STEP time at the end of each month in their Request for Reimbursement (RFR), but there will be no target numbers established for each individual element.
- A minimum number of documented vehicle stops must be made during each hour of enforcement so that enforcement efforts are consistent throughout the assigned shift. The minimum number of stops required depends on the grant type:
 - A minimum adjusted average of 2.5 vehicle stops per hour is required for STEP-COMP projects.
 - A minimum adjusted average of 1.5 stops per hour is required on STEP-CMV projects.
- Officers working STEP must witness the violation for which they stop a vehicle. Officers may not be dispatched or otherwise directed to violators, including through the use of spotters.
- All Daily Activity Reports (DAR) must be legible, contain appropriate additional documentation to describe long periods of inactivity, time-related details for activities that extend the vehicle stop beyond the typical contact with the operator such as roadside investigations, administration of SFST, arrests or waiting for towing services, and signed by a supervising officer.
- For purposes of documentation, each officer's DAR should reflect the Enforcement Zone in which the stop was made, the time and specific location of the stop (i.e. 4800 block of South Broadway). The officer should run the offender's driver license for warrants, run the vehicle registration for its history, and must document taking one of the following three actions:
 - Issuing a written warning

- Issuing a citation
- Making an arrest
- Officers may only claim arrest time for their own stops while working STEP or for stops made by other officers from their department working STEP.
- Only one officer may claim arrest time for any stop made on STEP time. Officers working STEP who briefly assist another officer working STEP must explain their actions on the DAR. Reimbursement for time assisting another STEP officer will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.
- Multiple officers on grant time may not work together in a single vehicle.

Proposal Development

The following relates to information subgrantees will need to develop their STEP proposal.

Administrative Requirements

Prior to executing a STEP-COMP or STEP-CMV grant, the agency must:

- Have an approved and current overtime policy that authorizes STEP enforcement.
- Have approved and current STEP Policies and Procedures document that outline the agency's administrative controls and operational concepts. The document must be signed by a department official with a cover letter indicating the policies and procedures are valid for enforcement in the intended grant year.

At a minimum, STEP Policies and Procedures must include:

- Roles and Responsibilities – Which position serves as STEP project director and a list of their main responsibilities, including detailed information for supervisory review prior to reimbursement request. The detailed information

must include timesheets, DARs, citations, etc., and how often the reviews will occur.

- STEP Shifts – How the agency selects individuals to work a STEP shift.
- Authorization to Work – How prior approval is obtained for an individual authorized to work a STEP shift.
- Work Restrictions – Any restrictions imposed on working STEP, such as limitations on the number of hours an officer may work per shift, etc.
- Supervision – How the agency supervises officers working STEP shifts.
- Overtime Status – How the agency determines an individual's overtime status before working STEP.
- Documentation – How an individual's time worked on a STEP shift is documented, including circumstances for arrest time and for clocking in and out of STEP.
- Required STEP Documentation – The paperwork required after the STEP shift ends. This includes time sheets, overtime cards, DARs, citations, etc.
- Approval Process – The process the supervisor uses to approve and document the hours worked.
- Performance Targets – The process used to oversee the agency's performance toward meeting the grant's performance measures.

Salary and Fringe Benefits Information

Proposing agencies will be required to create a budget based on estimated officer salaries and fringe benefits. Enforcement can only be conducted when in overtime status. Agencies will use average overtime salaries for the various ranks of officers

expected to work STEP enforcement as well as the components that make up their agency's fringe benefits.

The number of enforcement hours on the project will determine the total number of Enforcement Zones. See details in Enforcement Zones Operational Plan below.

Baseline Enforcement Information

Baseline enforcement information serves as a foundation for proposers to measure non-grant traffic enforcement activity against that provided through STEP grants. This information must be provided by the proposers and includes the total number of arrests, citations and warnings made during non-STEP vehicle stops the proposing agency made in the past 12 months. The information must exclude any activity generated with STEP grant dollars. Once the enforcement baseline is established, these figures will be used to compare subsequent years' local and grant-funded traffic enforcement activity against crash data the agency provides to TxDOT.

Baseline KA (Fatal and Serious Injury) Crash Data

Proposers must enter the three-year-average KA crash data for their jurisdiction as provided by TxDOT. The baseline numbers are critical in establishing the number and key contributing factors for fatal and serious-injury crashes in a community and are used to measure the effectiveness of grant-related enforcement efforts in reducing crashes. This information is found on the Texas Law Enforcement Liaison website at: <https://txlel.org/txdot-step-resources/>

County Sheriff's Departments and Constable's Offices should use the KA crash data for the county, found under "Outside City Limits (county name)" unless otherwise approved by TxDOT.

Enforcement Zones Operational Plan

Agencies will use geolocated KA crash data from the CRIS database to establish the foundation for at least two STEP Enforcement Zones within their jurisdiction. Crash

heat maps for your jurisdiction developed by the Texas Department of Public Safety's Highway Safety Operations Center (DPS-HSOC) are available by visiting the Texas Law Enforcement Liaison website at: Texas Law Enforcement Liaison website at: <https://txlel.org/txdot-step-resources/>

Proposers must use the FY 2027 STEP-COMP or FY 2027 STEP-CMV mapping portal provided by the DPS-HSOC to identify and measure the locations of their Enforcement Zones. The mapping portal is found at:

A comprehensive map of all the agency's requested zones and detailed maps of each zone will be uploaded to the grant proposal in the Operational Plan Enforcement Zones portion of the document.

Every STEP-COMP and STEP-CMV agency may develop an appropriate number of Enforcement Zones per grant. The formula for determining the maximum number of Enforcement Zones is 40 enforcement hours per zone per month, or 480 enforcement hours per year per zone. The minimum two zones require 960 hours. Consequently, an agency proposing three zones needs at least 1,440 enforcement hours to qualify.

Enforcement Zones should encompass the locations of one or more KA crashes. Agencies may supplement CRIS KA data with additional data to support zone development. There are two types of Enforcement Zones:

- Linear – Measured end-to-end on a section of roadway. Usually more appropriate to higher speed roadways. Maximum size is 6 linear miles as measured by the DPS mapping platform.
- Area – Measured as the area inside a shape bounded on all sides by roadways. Usually more appropriate for use inside city limits and on lower speed roadways. Maximum size is 4 square miles as measured by the DPS mapping platform.

All STEP Enforcement Zones must be approved by TxDOT prior to enforcement beginning in that zone. Identifying new Enforcement Zones after the grant begins is discouraged. However, if requested, agencies may be asked to delete a zone for each new zone added to maintain the maximum allowed number of zones. STEP enforcement should be used to patrol areas identified through historical crash data, not to react to short-term trends. Zones created to satisfy a short-term or temporary issue are not permitted.

Public Information & Education (PI&E)

Law enforcement agencies are required to conduct PI&E activities throughout the grant period. Salaries being claimed for PI&E activities must be included in the budget, but when combined with administrative costs may not exceed 10% of the total TxDOT award.

Law enforcement agencies are required to provide a minimum number of documented PI&E activities throughout the grant period as outlined in the grant proposal. STEP-CMV projects do not have PI&E requirements.

Outreach events should coincide with identified holiday mobilization periods and include motorist education efforts. For example, during the Memorial Day Mobilization period, otherwise known as Click-It-Or-Ticket, agencies should develop media opportunities focused on the importance of buckling up and properly securing children, or a similarly themed community event.

Proposal Submission

Proposals must be submitted via eGrants by changing the status to "Proposal Submitted." **The status of each proposal must be changed by no later than 5:00 p.m. CST on Friday, January 16, 2026.** At that time, the system will close, and proposals will no longer be able to be submitted.

TxDOT will review all proposals submitted through this process. Any modifications must be made prior to the project's execution. Proposers can receive assistance in writing their proposal by contacting eGrants Help at TRF_eGrantsHelp@txot.gov.

Eligibility

Internal Ethics and Compliance

Organizations will be required to undergo an Internal Compliance Program review prior to grant execution. Organizations must demonstrate compliance with Title 43 Texas Administrative Code §25.906(b) by certifying adoption of an internal ethics and compliance program that satisfies the requirements of Title 43 Texas Administrative Code §10.51 (relating to Internal Ethics and Compliance Program) prior to any grant execution.

Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)

Entities doing business with the federal government will use a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) created and registered in SAM.gov. Registration in SAM.gov must be current for the UEI to be valid.

Pre-Award Audit

Organizations may be required to undergo a Pre-Award Audit prior to grant execution.

Risk Assessment

A risk assessment module has been incorporated into eGrants in order to determine appropriate levels of monitoring of the project. The three-part module includes:

1. During the proposal process, a questionnaire must be filled out by the subgrantee for each proposal.

2. During the post-award grant delivery meeting, the TxDOT project manager will complete TxDOT's portion of the risk assessment for each grant.
3. After grant closeout, the system will determine the level of risk based on each grants performance during the grant year.

Terms and Conditions

Purpose - The main purpose of this RFP is to ensure uniform information in the solicitation of proposals and procurement of services. This RFP is not construed as a purchase agreement or contract or as a commitment of any kind, nor does it commit TxDOT to pay for costs incurred prior to the execution of a formal contract or grant unless such costs are specifically authorized in writing by TxDOT.

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Summary

Texas' Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) is a federally funded law enforcement grant program run by the Traffic Safety Division at the Texas Department of Transportation. The goal of the STEP program is for TxDOT to develop partnerships with law enforcement to reduce crashes by creating safer driving environments on Texas roadways through high-visibility enforcement (HVE).

STEP grants provide federal funding for overtime enforcement activities conducted by Texas law enforcement agencies. Organizations eligible for STEP funds include the Texas Department of Public Safety (TxDPS), sheriff's offices, constable's offices, and local police departments.

In accordance with 43 TAC §25.901, et seq., the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is requesting project proposals to support the targets and strategies of its Traffic Safety Program to reduce the number of motor vehicle related crashes, fatalities, and serious injuries in Texas.

The Texas Department of Transportation, in accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (78 Stat. 252, 42 U.S.C 2000d to 2000d-4) and the Regulations, hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded full and fair opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in consideration for an award.

Proposals submitted through this RFP will be reviewed for inclusion in the FY 2027 Annual Grant Application (AGA), which will be submitted to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) for approval and funding. The FY 2027 grant period is from October 1, 2026, through September 30, 2027.

Note: *Click-It-Or-Ticket*, *Operation: Slowdown* and *Impaired Driving Mobilization* proposals will be accepted through a separate process. For more information, contact eGrants Help at TRF_eGrantsHelp@txdot.gov.

Funding

Authority and Responsibility for funding of the traffic safety grant program derives from the National Highway Safety Act (23 USC §401, et seq.), and the Texas Traffic Safety Act (Transportation Code, Chapter 723). The Behavioral Traffic Safety Section (TRF-BTS) provides oversight of statewide projects and local projects at the agency's 25 districts. TRF-BTS administers the program within the Traffic Safety Division (TRF) of TxDOT.

The Texas Traffic Safety Program is funded with federal funds allocated from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) with Section 402 - State and Community Highway Safety Programs and Section 405 - National Priority Safety Programs (i.e., Occupant Protection, Impaired Driving Countermeasures, Motorcyclist Safety, and Nonmotorized Safety, among others).

STEP agency funding amounts are based on the number of enforcement hours the agency reasonably expects to work over the course of a full year. TxDOT may negotiate or amend a proposal's budget prior to execution.

All proposers are required to contribute 15% of the total budget in approved match.

Funding Constraints

- Funds are authorized on a federal fiscal year basis only. Awarded grants are contingent upon the availability of federal funds.
- Projects included in the AGA become cost reimbursable grant in-aid agreements.
- Federal and state grant funds cannot be used for lobbying.

- Supplanting is prohibited. Supplanting is defined as the “Use of federal funds to support personnel or an activity that is already supported (paid for) by local or state funds.”

Grant Types

STEP-Comprehensive (COMP) Grants

A STEP-COMP grant focuses enforcement efforts on reducing intersection-related violations, driving while intoxicated, failure to use occupant restraint systems, enforcement of state and local ordinances on cellular and texting devices and unsafe speed within the high-crash areas they identify, although any traffic-related probable cause may be used to initiate a vehicle stop.

STEP-Commercial Motor Vehicle (CMV) Grants

Law enforcement agencies may also request a STEP-CMV grant. Officers do not need to be specially certified to participate in STEP-CMV enforcement.

Federal inspections are not allowable on STEP projects. Officers conducting enforcement on a STEP-CMV grant must focus on state-level traffic violations, violations of local ordinances committed by CMVs, and on passenger vehicles whose unlawful actions such as improper lane changes which clearly cause a CMV to take evasive action or undertake hard-braking events.

STEP-COMP and STEP-CMV – Holiday Period Prioritization

STEP-COMP and CMV subgrantee agencies should prioritize enforcement activities during state and federally determined holiday periods, which occur during the months listed in parenthesis:

- Christmas-New Year’s (Dec-Jan 1)
- Spring Break (March)
- Memorial Day (May-June)
- Independence Day (June-July)
- Operation: Slowdown (July)
- Labor Day (August)

STEP Project Operational Requirements

The following items are requirements for both STEP-COMP and STEP-CMV grants:

- All enforcement activities must be initiated within, or in route to an established Enforcement Zone as outlined in the grant's Operational Plan.
- Agencies will document and report the numbers of warnings, citations and arrests made on STEP time at the end of each month in their Request for Reimbursement (RFR), but there will be no target numbers established for each individual element.
- A minimum number of documented vehicle stops must be made during each hour of enforcement so that enforcement efforts are consistent throughout the assigned shift. The minimum number of stops required depends on the grant type:
 - A minimum adjusted average of 2.5 vehicle stops per hour is required for STEP-COMP projects.
 - A minimum adjusted average of 1.5 stops per hour is required on STEP-CMV projects.
- Officers working STEP must witness the violation for which they stop a vehicle. Officers may not be dispatched or otherwise directed to violators, including through the use of spotters.
- All Daily Activity Reports (DAR) must be legible, contain appropriate additional documentation to describe long periods of inactivity, time-related details for activities that extend the vehicle stop beyond the typical contact with the operator such as roadside investigations, administration of SFST, arrests or waiting for towing services, and signed by a supervising officer.
- For purposes of documentation, each officer's DAR should reflect the Enforcement Zone in which the stop was made, the time and specific location of the stop (i.e. 4800 block of South Broadway). The officer should run the offender's driver license for warrants, run the vehicle registration for its history, and must document taking one of the following three actions:
 - Issuing a written warning

- Issuing a citation
- Making an arrest
- Officers may only claim arrest time for their own stops while working STEP or for stops made by other officers from their department working STEP.
- Only one officer may claim arrest time for any stop made on STEP time. Officers working STEP who briefly assist another officer working STEP must explain their actions on the DAR. Reimbursement for time assisting another STEP officer will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.
- Multiple officers on grant time may not work together in a single vehicle.

Proposal Development

The following relates to information subgrantees will need to develop their STEP proposal.

Administrative Requirements

Prior to executing a STEP-COMP or STEP-CMV grant, the agency must:

- Have an approved and current overtime policy that authorizes STEP enforcement.
- Have approved and current STEP Policies and Procedures document that outline the agency's administrative controls and operational concepts. The document must be signed by a department official with a cover letter indicating the policies and procedures are valid for enforcement in the intended grant year.

At a minimum, STEP Policies and Procedures must include:

- Roles and Responsibilities – Which position serves as STEP project director and a list of their main responsibilities, including detailed information for supervisory review prior to reimbursement request. The detailed information

must include timesheets, DARs, citations, etc., and how often the reviews will occur.

- STEP Shifts – How the agency selects individuals to work a STEP shift.
- Authorization to Work – How prior approval is obtained for an individual authorized to work a STEP shift.
- Work Restrictions – Any restrictions imposed on working STEP, such as limitations on the number of hours an officer may work per shift, etc.
- Supervision – How the agency supervises officers working STEP shifts.
- Overtime Status – How the agency determines an individual's overtime status before working STEP.
- Documentation – How an individual's time worked on a STEP shift is documented, including circumstances for arrest time and for clocking in and out of STEP.
- Required STEP Documentation – The paperwork required after the STEP shift ends. This includes time sheets, overtime cards, DARs, citations, etc.
- Approval Process – The process the supervisor uses to approve and document the hours worked.
- Performance Targets – The process used to oversee the agency's performance toward meeting the grant's performance measures.

Salary and Fringe Benefits Information

Proposing agencies will be required to create a budget based on estimated officer salaries and fringe benefits. Enforcement can only be conducted when in overtime status. Agencies will use average overtime salaries for the various ranks of officers

expected to work STEP enforcement as well as the components that make up their agency's fringe benefits.

The number of enforcement hours on the project will determine the total number of Enforcement Zones. See details in Enforcement Zones Operational Plan below.

Baseline Enforcement Information

Baseline enforcement information serves as a foundation for proposers to measure non-grant traffic enforcement activity against that provided through STEP grants. This information must be provided by the proposers and includes the total number of arrests, citations and warnings made during non-STEP vehicle stops the proposing agency made in the past 12 months. The information must exclude any activity generated with STEP grant dollars. Once the enforcement baseline is established, these figures will be used to compare subsequent years' local and grant-funded traffic enforcement activity against crash data the agency provides to TxDOT.

Baseline KA (Fatal and Serious Injury) Crash Data

Proposers must enter the three-year-average KA crash data for their jurisdiction as provided by TxDOT. The baseline numbers are critical in establishing the number and key contributing factors for fatal and serious-injury crashes in a community and are used to measure the effectiveness of grant-related enforcement efforts in reducing crashes. This information is found on the Texas Law Enforcement Liaison website at: <https://txlel.org/txdot-step-resources/>

County Sheriff's Departments and Constable's Offices should use the KA crash data for the county, found under "Outside City Limits (county name)" unless otherwise approved by TxDOT.

Enforcement Zones Operational Plan

Agencies will use geolocated KA crash data from the CRIS database to establish the foundation for at least two STEP Enforcement Zones within their jurisdiction. Crash

heat maps for your jurisdiction developed by the Texas Department of Public Safety's Highway Safety Operations Center (DPS-HSOC) are available by visiting the Texas Law Enforcement Liaison website at: Texas Law Enforcement Liaison website at: <https://txlel.org/txdot-step-resources/>

Proposers must use the FY 2027 STEP-COMP or FY 2027 STEP-CMV mapping portal provided by the DPS-HSOC to identify and measure the locations of their Enforcement Zones. The mapping portal is found at:

A comprehensive map of all the agency's requested zones and detailed maps of each zone will be uploaded to the grant proposal in the Operational Plan Enforcement Zones portion of the document.

Every STEP-COMP and STEP-CMV agency may develop an appropriate number of Enforcement Zones per grant. The formula for determining the maximum number of Enforcement Zones is 40 enforcement hours per zone per month, or 480 enforcement hours per year per zone. The minimum two zones require 960 hours. Consequently, an agency proposing three zones needs at least 1,440 enforcement hours to qualify.

Enforcement Zones should encompass the locations of one or more KA crashes. Agencies may supplement CRIS KA data with additional data to support zone development. There are two types of Enforcement Zones:

- Linear – Measured end-to-end on a section of roadway. Usually more appropriate to higher speed roadways. Maximum size is 6 linear miles as measured by the DPS mapping platform.
- Area – Measured as the area inside a shape bounded on all sides by roadways. Usually more appropriate for use inside city limits and on lower speed roadways. Maximum size is 4 square miles as measured by the DPS mapping platform.

All STEP Enforcement Zones must be approved by TxDOT prior to enforcement beginning in that zone. Identifying new Enforcement Zones after the grant begins is discouraged. However, if requested, agencies may be asked to delete a zone for each new zone added to maintain the maximum allowed number of zones. STEP enforcement should be used to patrol areas identified through historical crash data, not to react to short-term trends. Zones created to satisfy a short-term or temporary issue are not permitted.

Public Information & Education (PI&E)

Law enforcement agencies are required to conduct PI&E activities throughout the grant period. Salaries being claimed for PI&E activities must be included in the budget, but when combined with administrative costs may not exceed 10% of the total TxDOT award.

Law enforcement agencies are required to provide a minimum number of documented PI&E activities throughout the grant period as outlined in the grant proposal. STEP-CMV projects do not have PI&E requirements.

Outreach events should coincide with identified holiday mobilization periods and include motorist education efforts. For example, during the Memorial Day Mobilization period, otherwise known as Click-It-Or-Ticket, agencies should develop media opportunities focused on the importance of buckling up and properly securing children, or a similarly themed community event.

Proposal Submission

Proposals must be submitted via eGrants by changing the status to "Proposal Submitted." **The status of each proposal must be changed by no later than 5:00 p.m. CST on Friday, January 16, 2026.** At that time, the system will close, and proposals will no longer be able to be submitted.

TxDOT will review all proposals submitted through this process. Any modifications must be made prior to the project's execution. Proposers can receive assistance in writing their proposal by contacting eGrants Help at TRF_eGrantsHelp@txot.gov.

Eligibility

Internal Ethics and Compliance

Organizations will be required to undergo an Internal Compliance Program review prior to grant execution. Organizations must demonstrate compliance with Title 43 Texas Administrative Code §25.906(b) by certifying adoption of an internal ethics and compliance program that satisfies the requirements of Title 43 Texas Administrative Code §10.51 (relating to Internal Ethics and Compliance Program) prior to any grant execution.

Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)

Entities doing business with the federal government will use a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) created and registered in SAM.gov. Registration in SAM.gov must be current for the UEI to be valid.

Pre-Award Audit

Organizations may be required to undergo a Pre-Award Audit prior to grant execution.

Risk Assessment

A risk assessment module has been incorporated into eGrants in order to determine appropriate levels of monitoring of the project. The three-part module includes:

1. During the proposal process, a questionnaire must be filled out by the subgrantee for each proposal.

2. During the post-award grant delivery meeting, the TxDOT project manager will complete TxDOT's portion of the risk assessment for each grant.
3. After grant closeout, the system will determine the level of risk based on each grants performance during the grant year.

Terms and Conditions

15)	What is the hourly rate being used by Law enforcement for match purposes?	TxDOT does not have an average hourly rate of pay for law enforcement officers. A proposing agency must establish a rate and provide the methodology of how it was determined.
16)	If we already have an established approved indirect cost rate that is less than 10%, do we still have to provide supporting documentation? If we have never had an approved indirect cost rate and choose the 10% indirect cost rate, do we have to provide any supporting documentation?	Yes, if your agency has a current indirect cost rate that is approved annually by your cognizant agency, then you must use this rate and attach the supporting documentation to the proposal. The rate must be auditable. If an agency has never had a federally approved indirect cost rate, no supporting documentation is required to claim the de minimis rate of up to 15%. The rate must be calculated only on the TxDOT portion of your direct costs. The Match portion of your direct costs must be put as exemption.
17)	Can you please provide clarification on what is an acceptable cognizant agency?	Cognizant agency for indirect costs means the agency responsible for reviewing and approving the governmental unit's indirect cost rate(s).
18)	Can we choose to just use a portion of our approved indirect cost rate (i.e. 20% of a 30% rate) in our proposal and use the difference (i.e. the remaining 10%) as match?	Yes, the difference can be claimed as match in the proposal.
19)	Are subgrantees subject to GSA travel guidelines for hotel costs?	Yes, TxDOT reimbursement follows the hotel and per diem rates established by GSA.
20)	Is there an example of the daily activity (time & effort) report on eGrants?	Yes, there are several examples of STEP Daily Activity Reports on the eGrants help page under "STEP Tool Box" https://egrants.bts.txdot.gov/eGrantsHelp/index.html
21)	Can you please provide a list of approved projects, proposals and budgets from previous years?	TxDOT posts the current years approved project list and current Highway Safety Plan on eGrantsHelp.
