Sir,

Here is the monthly report for December 2025

1. 26 traffic stops were made; 24 citations were issued and 13 warnings issued. 10 hours were spent monitoring school zones.
2. 2 Writ of Possession were executed, and three 24 Hour Warning Notices were posted.
3. We received 23 civil citations; 69 attempts of service were made with 22 civil citations executed. 5 civil citations were executed by alternative service and by mailing a copy of the citation along with the petition by first class mail to the defendants.
4. A total of 495 hours has been spent at the schools. The hours were lower at schools this month due to the holidays. We had 408 security checks and 17 school lock downs. We spent 102 hours doing traffic control, as we continued to patrol the school areas to slow people down. We also assisted

with traffic control while people were dropping off and picking up their children from school.

5. We had 16 agency assists, including 3 with Fire and EMS assisting other agencies with various needs. 532 public assists were made, assisting citizens at schools and on patrol with various needs, and we also spent 31 hours securing Precinct 1 Justice Court. There were 50 hours spent doing Field Officer Training for newly commissioned deputies and our deputies also took 52 course hours of TCOLE training.
6. We had 20 new Environmental Reports, posted 10 Code Violation Notices, and mailed 10 Code Violation Notices. We started 20 new Code Violation Cases. We followed up on 8 different Code Enforcement Violation Cases and had 15 cases of Nuisance Dumping and 5 felony dumping cases. We spent 10 hours communicating with various courts on Environmental Issues.

We are continuously striving to provide the best service for the constituents of Precinct 1 and all citizens of Caldwell County.



- 6) requires collection of information relating to motor vehicle stops in which a warning or citation is issued and to arrests made as a result of those stops, including information relating to:

 - b. whether a search was conducted and, if so, whether the individual detained consented to the search;
 - c. whether the peace officer knew the race or ethnicity of the individual detained before detaining that individual;
 - d. whether the peace officer used physical force that resulted in bodily injury during the stop;
 - e. the location of the stop;
 - f. the reason for the stop.
- 7) requires the chief administrator of the agency, regardless of whether the administrator is elected, employed, or appointed, to submit an annual report of the information collected under Subdivision (6) to:
 - a. the Commission on Law Enforcement; and
 - b. the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency, if the agency is an agency of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state.

DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT
(THE PECAN RV PARK)

This Development Agreement (the "Agreement") for a new RV Park (the "Project") is made by and between CALDWELL COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Texas (the "County"), and RANCHULO, LLC/CELSO REYES (hereinafter collectively called "Ranchulo" or "Developer" or "Declarant"). The County and the Developer are each referred to as a "Party" and together referred to as the "Parties." The "Effective Date" of this Agreement shall be the date that it is executed by the Caldwell County Judge, which will occur following its approval by the Caldwell County Commissioners Court.

WHEREAS:

- A. Developer owns 8.2 acres, more or less, of real property (the "Ranchulo Property"), which is described by metes-and-bounds detail of LOT 4 in that certain instrument entitled "Plat of the Grove" dated August 30th, 2004 where CURTIS P. CLOGSTON AND KIM B CLOGSTON Subdivide 11.38-acre tract, recorded in Cabinet B Slide 44, of the Official Records of Caldwell County, Texas. The Developer also owns 5.81 acres, more or less, of real property (the "Reyes Property"), which is described by metes-and-bounds detail in that certain instrument entitled "Warranty Deed with Vendor's Lien" dated February 28, 2022 where KYLE HAHN as Grantor, to CELSO RAUL REYES RAMIREZ, A MARRIED PERSON, as Grantee, recorded under Instrument No. 2022-001615, in the Official Public Records of Caldwell County, Texas; and the description of the entire Ranchulo and Reyes Properties are attached in **Exhibit A-1** and incorporated by reference.
- B. Developer desires to develop the Project as generally described and depicted on **Exhibit B** and **Exhibit C**, attached hereto (the "Project").
- C. The portion of the Reyes and Ranchulo Property that is included in the Project, and therefore covered by this Agreement, is described by metes-and-bounds detail in the attached **Exhibit A-2** and incorporated by reference.
- D. The Parties are in agreement that construction of improvements for the Project will benefit the Ranchulo and Reyes Properties and the citizens of Caldwell County, and it will also help promote economic development within the County.
- E. The County and the Developer desire to design, engineer, and construct the Project pursuant to the terms and conditions stated herein.
- F. This Agreement outlines and clarifies the conditions for the Project under which variances to the technical requirements of the Caldwell County Development Ordinance (the "Development Ordinance") will be granted in exchange for a mutually agreeable alternate standard that meets the intent of the Development Ordinance and is in the interest of both Parties.

NOW, THEREFORE:

In consideration of the promises and mutual agreements set forth herein, **the County and the Developer agree, evidenced by their signatures below, as follows:**

1. General Terms and Conditions:

A. Developer desires to develop the Project (on *the* land described on **Exhibit A**, and in the manner described on the attached **Exhibit B** and **Exhibit C**) as the RV Park to be located at 321 Mill Rd, Maxwell, Texas 78656, which when completely built out according to present plans will contain up to 55 RV sites.

B. The "Project" is a proposed RV Park development on the above-referenced Ranchulo and Reyes properties, together with all related construction, utilities services extensions, drainage and other improvements to be constructed or implemented in connection with the planned RV Park.

C. THE PECAN RV PARK is intended to provide long-term rental spaces (exceeding 30 days) for Recreational Vehicles ("RV") as described herein, and not other types of non-traditional and moveable housing units. For purposes of this Agreement, a list and description of allowable vehicles that will occupy spaces in the RV Park is attached as **Exhibit D**.

D. It is expressly understood and agreed that no mobile homes or manufactured homes will be located within the Project unless otherwise mutually agreed in writing between Developer (or the Developers' successors or assigns) and the County.

E. The benefit to the Parties set forth in this Agreement which exceed the minimum requirements of State law and the Development Ordinance are good and valuable consideration for this Agreement, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged by both Parties, evidenced by their signatures below.

2. Developer Obligations

A. **Restrictions on Land Use.** Developer will, acting then as Declarant, implement land use control for the Project in the form of deed restrictions or restrictive covenants that encumber that portion of the Ranchulo and Reyes Properties that will be the Project (as defined in Exhibit A) for use by Developer/Declarant or any assign or successor in title, to include at least the following terms and conditions:

(i) **Housing Limited to RVs.** All housing within the Project will consist of Recreational Vehicles (incorporating the definition in **Exhibit D** attached hereto), specifically excluding from that definition mobile homes, site built residential structures, and manufactured homes.

(ii) **"Dark Sky" Lighting.** Any light fixture used for exterior illumination must be fully shielded, pointed downward and placed in a manner so that the light source is not directly visible from any other properties or public roadways. In order to reduce glare and light trespass into neighboring lands and to reduce negative impacts to wildlife, exterior illumination shall be restricted to light sources with a Correlated Color Temperature of 2,700K or less. As used herein, "Fully Shielded" means no direct uplight (i.e., no light emitted above the horizontal plane running through the lowest point on the fixture where light is emitted). The use of streetlights should be held to a minimum. The use of reflective surfaces should always be considered as an alternative to streetlights.

(iii) **Termination of Restrictions.** It is agreed by the Parties that the above described Restrictions will cease being effective and may be terminated by Developer upon the following: (a) termination of this Agreement; or (b) Developer or a subsequent owner of the Project elects to change the use of the Project from an RV Park, subject to the approval of the County of such change in use and approval of a site plan; or (c) mutual agreement of the Developer or subsequent owner of the Project and the County. In the event of any of the foregoing, the County and the then-owner of the Project agree to execute and record a document to be furnished by the owner of the Project memorializing such termination of the Restrictions in the Official Records of Caldwell County, Texas.

In the event the Restrictions are terminated pursuant to this subsection, and as a condition of their termination, the Developer and his assigns and successors agree to execute a waiver that: (a) releases the property from continued development under this Agreement and the Caldwell County Development Ordinance as it existed at the time of execution of this Agreement, as applicable; and (b) agrees to subject any subsequent application for land use, including platting, to the local regulations in effect at the time of the subsequent application's submittal.

B. **Community Amenities.** Amenities as generally described in **Exhibit C** shall be provided within the Project boundaries.

C. Construction Permit. The Applicant shall submit to the County a Commercial Construction Permit, including the required administrative completeness documents, inclusive of the improvements Developer will be making for the Project. Amendments or modifications will be made, as needed or required, under that Commercial Construction Permit. No other permits will be required for the Project as covered by this Agreement, except for the permit(s) to be issued by the County for construction and operation of an On-Site Sewage Facility (OSSF) in accordance with the Order Adopting Rules of Caldwell County, Texas, for On-Site Sewage Facilities (Adopted on September 24, 2007, and Approved by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality on December 21, 2007).

D. Single Phase Site Development Plan. Developer and County agree that the Project will be submitted in a single Commercial Site Plan application. If there is to be subsequent phasing of the site design / permitting, each phase shall include necessary infrastructure to stand alone without completion of future phases and comply with all Caldwell County rules regulating commercial site development, subject to paragraph 3 below.

3. County Obligations.

A. County agrees to permit development and construction of the Project in accordance with general arrangement depicted in **Exhibit B** and the proposed variances and on the terms contained within **Exhibit C**, attached hereto.

B. County's approval of the Commercial Site Plan, subject to its existing rules and regulations, shall be effective for an initial period of five years.

C. Any other proposed or requested waiver or variance from the County's standards or technical requirements shall be subject to the administration and procedures of the Development Ordinance.

4. Miscellaneous and Legal Matters.

A. Actions Performable. The County and the Developer agree that all actions to be performed under this Agreement are performable and enforceable in Caldwell County, Texas.

8. Default. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, no Party shall be deemed to be in default hereunder until the passage of ninety (90) calendar days after receipt by such party of written notice of default from the other Party. Upon the passage of ninety (90) calendar days without cure of the default, such Party shall be deemed to have defaulted for purposes of this Agreement.

C. Definitions and Enforcement. Interpretations and enforcement of the terms of this Agreement will be consistent with Chapter 1.0 (Authority) and Chapter 2.0 (Definitions) of the Development Ordinance, which are incorporated herein by reference.

D. Termination

- (i) Of Restrictions- See Section 2(A)(iii) above regarding terms of Termination of the Restrictions imposed on the Project portion of the Ranchulo and Reyes Properties for development of the Project.
- (ii) Of this Agreement - This Agreement may be terminated at any time by mutual agreement between the Parties. Subject to the terms of said mutual agreement, Developer acknowledges that any termination of this Agreement will subject an improvement made under this agreement to local regulations as they then-existed at the time of Developer's submitted land use agreement.

E. Governing Law. The County and Developer agree that this Agreement has been made under the laws of the State of Texas in effect on this date, and that any interpretation of this Agreement at a future date shall be made under the laws of the State of Texas.

F. Severability. If a provision hereof shall be finally declared void or illegal by any court or administrative agency having jurisdiction, the entire Agreement shall not be void, but the remaining provisions shall continue in effect as nearly as possible in accordance with the original intent of the Parties.

F. Complete Agreement, Merger and Changes. This Agreement represents a complete agreement of the Parties and supersedes all prior written and oral matters related to this Agreement. Any amendment to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by all Parties.

G. Exhibits. All exhibits attached to this Agreement are incorporated by reference and expressly made part of this Agreement as if copied verbatim.

H. Notice. All notices, requests or other communications required or contemplated under this Agreement shall be **in writing** and shall be sent to the Party to whom notice is given **at the addresses (physical and virtual or electronic) shown below**, or to such substituted or updated addresses as may be later provided by written notice from one Party to the other Party, by:

I. Force Majeure. Developer and the County agree that the obligations of each party shall be subject to *force majeure* events such as natural calamity, fire, pandemic or strike.

J. Assignment. This Agreement may not be assigned by the Developer without the written consent of the Caldwell County Commissioners Court, which consent is not to be unreasonably withheld.

K. Signature Warranty and Authority. The signatories to this Agreement represent and warrant that they have the authority to execute this Agreement on behalf of the County and Developer, respectively, in the capacities shown.

L. Multiple Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in multiple originals and in several counterparts, all of which taken together shall constitute one single Agreement between the Parties.

M. Agreement Binds Successors and Runs with the Land. This Agreement shall bind and inure to the benefit of the Parties, their successors and assigns. The terms of this Agreement shall constitute covenants running with the land comprising the Project and shall be binding on and benefit all Owners of the Ranchulo and Reyes Properties. After the Effective Date hereof, this Agreement shall be recorded by the Developer, at the Developer's cost, in the Official Public Records of Caldwell County, Texas.




METES-AND-BOUNDS DESCRIPTION

PROJECT LAYOUT DRAWING





DESCRIPTION OF RV PARK INFRASTRUCTURE AND AMENITIES

ROADS:

All roads will be two-way and 20' wide, with 25 feet radii at intersections.

All roads shall be compacted base with a minimum compacted depth of 5 inches.

WATER:

All 55 RV sites will be supplied potable water by Maxwell Special Utility District, each site will have its own hose bib.

SEWER:

Each of the 55 RV sites will be served by a single OSSF system permitted and approved by Caldwell County.

ELECTRICAL:

Each RV site will be served by Blue Bonnet Electric. The primary electric will be overhead and secondary electric will be underground.

FLOODPLAIN:

A significant portion of the site is subject to shallow flooding during a 100-year storm event. Caldwell County acknowledges that some RV units will be located in areas of shallow flooding and takes no exception.

DETENTION:

Caldwell County acknowledges that detention is not required based on a Drainage Report prepared by Eckermann Engineering, Inc. July 2025 and accepted by Caldwell County on August 29th, 2025.

SET-BACKS:

10 foot minimum between each RV, with slide out extended

RV SPACES:

Material will be compacted road base sufficient to support an RV

Each space will be marked with a number that is reflective: at least 3 inches tall: and will be clearly visible from the road.

DUMPSTERS:

When finished there will be 1 dumpster at the site.

RESTROOMS (inside Community Center):

Men's: Women's

- 1) CAMPING TRAILER – A folding structure mounted on wheels and designed for travel, recreation and vacation use
- 2) MOTOR HOME – A portable, temporary dwelling to be used for travel, recreation and vacation, constructed as an integral part of a self- propelled vehicle.
- 3) PICKUP COACH – A structure designed to be mounted on a truck chassis for use as a temporary dwelling for travel, recreation, and vacation
- 4) TRAVEL TRAILER – A vehicular structure built on a chassis with body width not to exceed eight and one-half feet and body length less than 46 feet.
- 5) PARK MODEL RV – A structure built on a single chassis with a gross area not to exceed 400 square feet.
- 6) TINY HOUSE ON WHEELS – A portable, temporary dwelling under 400 square feet in size that occupies one recreational vehicle space and is mounted on a trailer, wheels, or other mobile undercarriage.

NON-ALLOWABLE VEHICLES:

Additionally, it is expressly understood by and agreed to by Ranchulo, LLC and Celso Reyes that **no mobile home, site-built structure or manufactured home will be located on the Property unless otherwise mutually agreed to in writing** between the Declarant (or the Declarants' successors or assigns) and the County.




DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

This Development Agreement (the “Agreement”) is by and between **Caldwell County**, a political subdivision of the state of Texas (“County”), and **Chelle Holdings, Inc.**, a Texas corporation (“Developer”). This Agreement shall become effective (a) upon receipt by the County of all fees due in connection herewith and (b) the latter of the date (i) that it is executed by both parties, (ii) the Developer acquires the Property (as defined below), or (iii) the County and Schulle Farm Partners LP, both execute an amendment and restatement of the Original Agreement (as defined below).

WHEREAS, Developer has or will acquire approximately eighty-five (85) acres of real property, which is more particularly described in **Exhibit A**, attached hereto (the “Property”); and

WHEREAS, the County and Schulle Farm Partners LP, a Texas limited partnership (“Schulle Farm”) previously entered into that Development Agreement recorded on January 18, 2024, recorded under Document No. 2024-000383 of the Official Public Records of Caldwell County, Texas (“Original Agreement”) that burdened the Property, and the County and Schulle Farm, contingent upon Developer entering into this Agreement, removed the Property from the Original Agreement in that certain Amended and Restated Development Agreement dated as of **December []**, 2025; and

WHEREAS, Developer has no current intent to subdivide the Property; and

WHEREAS, Developer intends to immediately utilize the Property as outdoor, covered, and indoor storage for prefabricated concrete products (the “Project”) which will increase the commercial traffic on and along Railroad Street from the southwest corner of the Property to TX 142 as generally depicted on the concept plan attached hereto as **Exhibit B** (the “Concept Plan”); and

WHEREAS, as consideration to induce the County to remove the Property from the Original Agreement, Developer has agreed to make certain roadway improvements from the southwest corner of the Property along Railroad Street to TX-142 (“Roadway Improvements”); and

WHEREAS, the area for Developer Roadway Improvements is depicted in red on the diagram attached hereto as Exhibit “B”; and

WHEREAS, the County and Developer desire that the Roadway Improvements be designed, engineered and constructed pursuant to the terms and conditions stated herein; and

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the promises and mutual agreements set forth herein, the County and Developer agree as follows:

1. General Terms and Conditions

a. Permitted Uses;


i. The “Project” is defined as the commercial and industrial use of the Property, including but not limited to, (i) the use of the Property as a storage yard for prefabricated concrete products, concrete manufacturing materials, concrete manufacturing by-products, storage of equipment and machinery, and (ii) additional commercial and industrial structures facilitating the operations of the storage yard. (collectively, the “Permitted Uses”). In addition to use of the Property as a storage yard, the Property may be developed and used for the following commercial and industrial uses (collectively, the “Permitted Alternative Uses”):

- a) Contractor shops and offices;
- b) Manufacturing and assembly uses; and

- c) Associated office, breakroom, and accessory uses customarily incidental to the foregoing.
- ii. The Permitted Alternative Uses contemplated herein shall comply with Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (“TCEQ”) standards and permitting requirements as applicable and published by the TCEQ regulating air quality, land-based activities, and water quality.
- b. The Project shall be developed in accordance with the regulations, ordinances and other requirements of the County in effect as of the effective date of this Agreement. No subsequent regulations, ordinances or other requirements may be imposed upon Developer, the Project, the Property without the express written consent of Developer. Should Developer elect to comply with a subsequently adopted regulation, ordinance or other requirement of the County, such election shall not constitute or result in modification, amendment or waiver of Developer's right to develop the Project in accordance with the rules, ordinances or other requirements in effect as of the effective date. The parties agree that the foregoing shall not apply to regulations, ordinances or other requirements that are: (1) adopted to modify the County's procedures for processing of development permits and other applications in compliance with applicable Texas law; (2) adopted to prevent imminent destruction of property or injury to persons from flooding that are effective only within a flood plain established by a federal flood control program and enacted to prevent the flooding of buildings intended for public occupancy; (3) adopted to prevent the imminent destruction of property or injury to persons; or (4) required as a result of federal or state laws or judicial decisions after the effective date of this Agreement, if the regulations do not affect landscaping or tree preservation, open space or park dedication, lot size, lot dimensions, lot coverage, building size, residential or commercial density, or the timing of a project, or change development permitted by a restrictive covenant required by the County.

2. Developer Obligations

- a. Developer will chip and seal the existing Railroad Street to current County specifications in the area depicted in Exhibit B; notwithstanding the foregoing, Developer shall not be required to acquire additional land outside of the current right of way nor incur any future maintenance obligations of Railroad Street.
- b. The Property shall be provided with access via Railroad Street. Only emergency vehicle access will be granted to 5th Street under this agreement. If non-emergency access is requested from 5th Street, the Developer and County shall negotiate a Roadway Donation Agreement that provides for proportionate improvements to 5th Street from the Developer.
- c. Prior to occupying the Property for commercial use, the Developer, at Developer's sole expense, shall construct certain improvements to Railroad Street (the “Roadway Improvements”). The Roadway Improvements to Railroad Street shall consist of full depth reconstruction having a pavement section of: 6-inches of subgrade compacted to 95% of standard proctor, 10-inches of flexible base, and 3-inches of hot mix asphaltic concrete with a nominal total width of 28-feet. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the total width of pavement may be adjusted to fit within existing right of way for Railroad Street.

d. Trip Generation and Traffic Impact Analysis.

- i. Prior to a Permitted Alternative Use other than use of the Property as a storage yard as described in Section 1.a, the Developer (or successor owner) shall submit to the County Engineer a trip generation memorandum (the “Trip Generation Report”). The Trip Generation Report shall:
 - a) Be prepared in accordance with the most current edition of the Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE) Trip Generation Manual in effect at the time of submittal;
 - b) Identify the applicable ITE land use code(s) and corresponding daily and peak hour trip generation rates or equations; and
 - c) Present estimated average weekday daily trips and AM and PM peak hour trips for the proposed use and site program.
- ii. If the Trip Generation Report demonstrates that the new Permitted Alternative Use proposed will generate more than 300 average weekday daily trips or more than 30 trips in the highest adjacent street peak hour (AM or PM) in addition to the traffic counts at the time of the Trip Generation Report, the County Engineer may require the Developer to prepare and submit an updated traffic impact analysis (“Updated TIA”) for County review and approval.
- iii. If an Updated TIA is required under subsection ii, then any provision of this Agreement that would otherwise exempt the Developer from constructing roadway or intersection improvements beyond the Roadway Improvements described in Section 2.c shall not apply to the proposed Permitted Alternative Use, and the Developer may be required, as a condition of County approval of the site development plans or building permits for such use, to construct or fund additional roadway or intersection improvements identified in the Updated TIA and accepted by the County.

- iv. The County retains its authority to deny or condition approvals based on public safety and roadway capacity considerations consistent with applicable Texas law.

3. **County Obligations**

County agrees to permit construction of the Roadway Improvements in accordance the Caldwell County Ordinances in effect as of the Effective Date and in accordance with the terms contained herein. Any other proposed or requested waiver or variance from the County's standards or technical requirements shall be subject to the administration and procedures of the Caldwell County Ordinances in effect as of the Effective Date.

- 4. **Actions Performable.** The County and the Developer agree that all actions to be performed under this Agreement are performable in Caldwell County, Texas.
- 5. **Default.** Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, no party shall be deemed to be in default hereunder until the passage of thirty (30) calendar days after receipt by such party of notice of default from the other party. Upon the passage of thirty (30) calendar days without cure of the default, such party shall be deemed to have defaulted for purposes of this Agreement. If any party defaults under this Agreement and fails to cure the default within the applicable cure period, the non-defaulting Party will have all rights and remedies available under this Agreement or applicable law, including the right to institute legal action to cure any default, to enjoin any threatened or attempted violation of this Agreement or to enforce the defaulting party's obligations under this Agreement by specific performance or writ of mandamus.
- 6. **Governing Law and Venue.** The County and Developer agree that this Agreement has been made under the laws of the State of Texas in effect on this date and that any interpretation of this Agreement at a future date shall be made under the laws of the State of Texas. Venue for any matter with respect to this Agreement shall be brought in the State Courts sitting in Caldwell County, Texas, or the Federal Courts in the Western District of Texas.
- 7. **Changes in writing.** Any changes or additions or alterations to this Agreement must be agreed to in writing with signatures of both parties.
- 8. **Severability.** If a provision hereof shall be finally declared void or illegal by any court or administrative agency having jurisdiction, the entire Agreement shall not be void, but the remaining provisions shall continue in effect as nearly as possible in accordance with the original intent of the parties.
- 9. **Complete Agreement.** This Agreement represents a complete agreement of the parties and supersedes all prior written and oral negotiations, correspondence and agreements related to the subject matter of this Agreement. Any amendment to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by all parties.
- 10. **Exhibits.** All exhibits attached to this Agreement are incorporated by reference and expressly made part of this Agreement as if copied verbatim.
- 11. **Notice.** All notices, requests or other communications required or permitted by this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be sent by (i) email transmission, to the party to whom notice is given at the email address for such party set forth below, (ii) by overnight courier or hand delivery, or

(iii) certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, and addressed to the parties at the following addresses:

12. **Force Majeure.** Developer and the County agree that neither party shall be deemed in default of this Agreement to the extent that any delay or failure in performance of its obligations hereunder results from a force majeure event such as natural disaster or calamity, fire, flood, act of God, war, riot, terrorist acts, insurrection, civil disturbances, exercise of governmental authority, national or regional emergencies or disasters, epidemic, pandemic strike, or other unforeseeable circumstances beyond such party's reasonable control.
13. **Assignment.** Except as expressly provided herein, this Agreement may not be assigned by the Developer without the written consent of the Caldwell County Commissioners Court, not to be unreasonably withheld. Developer may assign (in whole or in part) this Agreement, and the rights and obligations of Developer hereunder, to a subsequent purchaser of all or a portion of the Property provided that the assignee assumes all of the obligations hereunder with respect to the portion of the Property acquired by the Assignee. Any such assignment must be in writing, specifically describe the portion of the Property to which it applies, set forth the assigned rights and obligations, and be executed by the proposed assignee. A copy of the assignment must be delivered to the County and recorded in the real property records as may be required by applicable law. Upon any such assignment, the assignor will be released of any further obligations under this Agreement as to the applicable Property.
14. **Signature Warranty Clause.** The signatories to this Agreement represent and warrant that they have the authority to execute this Agreement on behalf of the County and Developer, respectively.
15. **Multiple Counterparts.** This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, all of which taken together shall constitute one single agreement between the parties.
16. **Agreement Binds Successors and Runs with the Land.** This Agreement shall bind and inure to the benefit of the parties, their successors and assigns. The terms of this Agreement shall constitute covenants running with the land comprising the Property and shall be binding on and benefit all owners of the Property. This Agreement will be effective on its recording by the Developer, at the Developer's cost, in the Official Public Records of Caldwell County, Texas.
17. **Approvals.** Notwithstanding any approval by the County of any plans, plots, specifications or other matters related to the Project, the Developer shall be solely responsible for assuring that all such

plans, plots, specifications and other matters conform strictly in accordance with all applicable Caldwell County ordinances and standards (except to the extent of any variance specifically granted herein).



AMENDED AND RESTATED DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

This Amended and Restated Development Agreement (the “Amended and Restated Agreement”) is by and between Caldwell County, a political subdivision of the State of Texas (“County”), and Schulle Farm Partners LP, a Texas limited partnership (“Declarant”). This Agreement shall become effective (a) upon receipt by the County of all fees due in connection herewith and (b) the latter of the date (i) that it is executed by both parties, (ii) the Developer closes on the sale of the Sold Acreage (as defined below) and (iii) that the County and Chelle Holdings, Inc. (“Chelle”), both execute a development agreement for the Sold Acreage.

WHEREAS, the County and Declarant previously entered into that certain Development Agreement recorded on January 18, 2024, under Document No. 2024-000383 of the Official Public Records of Caldwell County, Texas (the “Original Agreement”), and the County and Declarant now desire to amend, restate and supersede the Original Agreement in all respects; and

WHEREAS, the Original Agreement covered approximately 226.852 acres of which Declarant has sold approximately 85.226 acres (the “Sold Acreage”) to Chelle; and

WHEREAS, Declarant now desires to remove the Sold Acreage from the Original Agreement and subject the remaining approximately 141.626 acres (which is more particularly described in Exhibit “A”, attached hereto (the “Property”) and which is located outside the extraterritorial jurisdiction of any municipality) to this Amended and Restated Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Declarant desires to subdivide and develop the Property as generally depicted on Exhibit “C”, attached hereto (the “Project”); and

WHEREAS, the County and Declarant desire to design, engineer, and construct the Project pursuant to the terms and conditions stated herein; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement delineates the conditions for the Project under which the variances to the technical requirements of the Caldwell County Development Ordinance will be granted in exchange for a mutually agreeable alternate standard which meets the intent of the Ordinance and is in the interest of both parties; and

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the promises and mutual agreements set forth herein, the County and Declarant agree as follows:

1. General Terms and Conditions

a. The “Project” is defined as the subdivision and development of the Property, together with all related construction, drainage, detention, and other improvements to be constructed or implemented on the Property.

b. Declarant desires to subdivide and develop a portion of the Property as depicted on **Exhibit "C"**, attached hereto and incorporated by reference, to be known as Schulle Farms, consisting of not more than 600 residential lots.

c. The benefit to the Parties set forth in this Agreement which exceeds the minimum requirements of State law and the Caldwell County Development Ordinance are good and valuable consideration for this Agreement, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged by both Parties.

2. Declarant Obligations

a. Declarant will implement, at a minimum, Deed Restrictions and/or Restrictive Covenants that encumber each lot, tract, or parcel, to include the following terms and conditions:

b. All permanent construction within the Project will consist of site-built structures, specifically excluding mobile homes, manufactured homes, and recreational vehicles. Declarant or its designee or assign may temporarily place one or more manufactured homes on-site for use as construction offices, which shall be removed promptly after completion of all development. Declarant or its designee or assign may additionally place one or more manufactured homes on site to satisfy any residency requirement for the creation of a municipal utility district and the election of directors thereof.

c. The deed restrictions shall include the following Dark Sky provision:

“Any light fixture used for exterior illumination must be fully shielded, pointed downward, and placed in a manner so that the light source is not directly visible from any other properties or public roadways. In order to reduce glare and light trespass into neighboring lands and to reduce negative impacts to wildlife, exterior illumination shall be restricted to light sources with a Correlated Color Temperature of 2,700K or less. As used herein, “Fully Shielded” means no direct uplight (i.e., no light emitted above the horizontal plane running through the lowest point on the fixture where light is emitted). The use of streetlights should be held to a minimum. The use of reflective surfaces should always be considered as an alternative to streetlights.”

d. Any and all open space, sidewalks, street lighting, storm sewers, and detention facilities constructed by Declarant shall be dedicated and maintained by home owners or property owners associations established for the purpose of owning and managing the common land or amenities and whose documents have been accepted and/or approved by the County.

The Residential designation shown on Exhibit C (the “Concept Plan”) shall allow for lot widths ranging from forty feet (40’) to forty-five feet (45’) to fifty feet (50’) or more in width. A minimum

of fifteen percent (15%) of the lots shall have a width of at least fifty feet (50'). If the Concept Plan is amended to include thirty-five feet (35') lots, then no more than fifteen percent (15%) of the lots shall have a width of less than forty feet (40').

e. All single-family homes to be site-built.

f. All single-family detached homes on forty-foot (40') wide lots or wider shall contain a minimum of a 2-car garage. All single-family detached driveways on forty foot (40') wide lots or wider shall be a minimum of twenty feet (20') in depth as measured from the right-of-way and sixteen feet (16') in width.

g. For lots narrower than forty-foot (40') with a single residence, a minimum of two off-street parking spaces shall be provided. Garage and driveway spaces shall count toward the parking requirements. Additional parking areas, including where feasible, street parking, shall be provided to accommodate at least one additional parking space for each lot less than forty-foot (40') in width.

h. Residential structures shall have a minimum 30-foot building setback from hydrocarbon-carrying pipeline easements.

i. Declarant shall reimburse County for costs incurred in the County Engineer's review of this Amended and Restated Development Agreement within forty-five (45) days of receiving notice of such costs.

j. Declarant and County agree that subsequent development of the Project, if in phases, shall comply with all Caldwell County rules regulating subdivision of real property, development, and construction, subject to paragraph 3 below.

k. The Project shall incorporate parkland and/or open space and parkland improvements in conformity with Exhibit "C", attached hereto and made a part hereof. Twenty-five percent (25%) of the parkland shall be dedicated prior to the completion of Phase 2 or 300 single-family homes, whichever comes first. Such parkland and/or open space shall be dedicated to and maintained by home owners or property owners association established for the purpose of owning and managing the common land or amenities and whose documents have been accepted and/or approved by the County.

l. Street layouts will be generally as shown on Exhibit "C", and all streets will be constructed in accordance with the applicable County regulatory design and construction standards. Changes to the street layout may be made so long as the changes provide equivalent regional connectivity and comply with this Agreement and applicable Caldwell County regulations, as modified by Exhibit "B" to this Agreement.

m. During the four-year period beginning on the effective date of the Original Agreement (such period, the "Commercial/Industrial Period"), Declarant may develop the area designated as "Commercial/Industrial" on Exhibit "C" only with commercial or industrial uses included on Exhibit "D". If the area designated as "Commercial/Industrial"

on **Exhibit “C”** has not been developed within the Commercial/Industrial Period, Declarant may elect to develop some or all of the area with residential uses. Any commercial or industrial development shall comply with the Caldwell County Development Ordinance.

n. The County and Declarant acknowledge that Declarant caused KimleyHorn to prepare a traffic impact analysis (“TIA”) dated May 28, 2024, which encompassed the entire 226.852 acres covered by the Original Agreement. Declarant shall be allowed to submit a revised TIA assessing the traffic impacts arising solely from the Project as amended by this Agreement and shall not be required to make street improvements attributable to the Sold Acreage.

o. If a wastewater treatment plant is constructed within the property, the Declarant shall require the wastewater treatment plant to have a TCEQ permitted discharge standard meeting or exceeding the following:

1. Biological Oxygen Demand (5-day), mg/l: 5
2. Total Suspended Solids, mg/l" 5
3. Ammonia Nitrogen, mg/l: 2
4. Total Phosphorus, mg/l: 0.5

3. **County Obligations.** The County agrees to permit development and construction of the Project in accordance with **Exhibit “C”** and the variances and on the terms contained within **Exhibit “B”**, attached hereto, and such variances are hereby approved. Any other proposed or requested waiver or variance from the County’s standards or technical requirements shall be subject to the administration and procedures of the Caldwell County Development Ordinance. The variances contained within **Exhibit “B”** shall not apply to commercial or industrial development. Declarant may make major or minor amendments to the Concept Plan upon notification to the County. “Major amendments” are all amendments that (i) result in the total number of residential lots exceeding 600 lots, or (ii) a change in the alignment of roadways shown on the Concept Plan if the realignment does not provide equivalent regional connectivity to that shown on the Concept Plan. All major amendments must be approved by Commissioner’s Court. “Minor amendments” are all amendments that are not major amendments and may be made by Declarant without approval of the County upon providing notice of the revised Concept Plan. The County agrees that minor amendments shall not be deemed a change in project for purposes of Declarant’s vested rights under Chapter 245 of the Texas Local Government Code.

4. **Actions Performable.** The County and the Declarant agree that all actions to be performed under this Agreement are performable in Caldwell County, Texas.

5. **Default.** Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, no party shall be deemed to be in default hereunder until the passage of ninety (90) calendar days after receipt by such party of notice of default from the other party. Upon the passage of ninety (90) calendar days without cure of the default, such party shall be deemed to have defaulted for purposes of this Agreement.

6. Governing Law. The County and Declarant agree that this Agreement has been made under the laws of the State of Texas in effect on this date and that any interpretation of this Agreement at a future date shall be made under the laws of the State of Texas.

7. Changes in Writing. Any changes or additions or alterations to this Development Agreement must be agreed to in writing with the signatures of both parties.

8. Severability. If a provision hereof shall be finally declared void or illegal by any court or administrative agency having jurisdiction, the entire Agreement shall not be void, but the remaining provisions shall continue in effect as nearly as possible in accordance with the original intent of the parties.

9. Complete Agreement. This Agreement represents a complete agreement of the parties and supersedes all prior written and oral matters related to this Agreement. Any amendment to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by all parties.

10. Exhibits. All exhibits attached to this Agreement are incorporated by reference and expressly made part of this Agreement as if copied verbatim.

11. Notice. All notices, requests or other communications required or permitted by this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be sent by (i) email transmission to the party to whom notice is given at the email address for such party set forth below, (ii) overnight courier or hand delivery, or (iii) certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, and addressed to the parties at the following addresses:

12. Force Majeure. Declarant and the County agree that the obligations of each party shall be subject to force majeure events such as natural calamity, fire, pandemic, or strike.

13. Assignment. This Agreement may not be assigned by the Declarant without the written consent of the Caldwell County Commissioners Court.

14. Signature Warranty Clause. The signatories to this Agreement represent and warrant that they have the authority to execute this Agreement on behalf of the County and Declarant, respectively.

15. Multiple Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, all of which, taken together, shall constitute one single agreement between the parties.

16. Prior Agreement Superseded. This Agreement amends, supersedes, and replaces the Original Agreement in all respects, and the Original Agreement is null and void.

17. Sold Property. Provided that Chelle enters into a development agreement with the County for the Sold Property prior to, or contemporaneously with the execution of this Agreement, the Sold Property is hereby released and removed from the Original Agreement and this Agreement.

18. Agreement Binds Successors and Runs with the Land. This Agreement shall bind and inure to the benefit of the parties, their successors and assigns. The terms of this Agreement shall constitute covenants running with the land comprising the Property and shall be binding on and benefitting all Owners. After the effective date hereof, this Agreement, at the County's cost, shall be recorded in the Official Public Records of Caldwell County, Texas.

19. 17. Approvals. Notwithstanding any approval by the County of any plans, plots, specifications or other matters related to the Project, the Developer shall be solely responsible for assuring that all such plans, plots, specifications and other matters conform strictly in accordance with all applicable Caldwell County ordinances and standards (except to the extent of any variance specifically granted herein).





A RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF CALDWELL COUNTY, TEXAS ("COUNTY") FOR THE GRANT APPLICATION TO THE CAPITAL AREA METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION FOR CONSTRUCTION FUNDING FOR FM 2001 EAST (FROM GRAEF ROAD TO EXISTING FM 2001 SOUTHEAST OF SH 21).

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Caldwell County is aware that both Hays County and Caldwell County are two of the fastest-growing counties in the State of Texas and the nation; and

WHEREAS, the expansion of inter-county transportation systems between Hays and Caldwell Counties, including connections to SH 21 from both counties, is needed in order to meet the demand caused by population and business growth in these counties; and

WHEREAS, funding from the 2028-2031 CAMPO Call for Projects (Surface Transportation Block Grant) would afford the construction of the FM 2001 East project from Graef Road in Hays County to Existing FM 2001 Southeast of SH 21 in Caldwell County; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court believes funding under the 2028-2031 CAMPO Call for Projects (Surface Transportation Block Grant) program would provide enhanced connectivity, safety, and mobility for travelers between Hays and Caldwell Counties, as well as those connecting from FM 2001 in Caldwell County to SH 21.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF CALDWELL COUNTY, TEXAS:

Section 1. The Commissioners Court of Caldwell County demonstrates strong support for Hays County to advance the FM 2001 East project from Graef Road to Existing FM 2001 Southeast of SH 21.

Section 2. The Commissioners Court of Caldwell County supports Hays County's submission of the application for funding under the 2028-2031 CAMPO Call for Projects for the construction of the FM 2001 East project from Graef Road to Existing FM 2001 Southeast of SH 21.

Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE

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ORDER 04-2024
ORDER APPOINTING THE CALDWELL COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES DISTRICT
BOARD OF EMERGENCY SERVICES COMMISSIONERS

WHEREAS, at an election held on the 7th day of November, 2023, in that part of Caldwell County, State of Texas, including the entirety of Caldwell County except the territory within extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City of Staples, and the territory within the city limits of the City of San Marcos, there was submitted to the qualified voters the question of whether that territory should be formed into an emergency services district under state law;

WHEREAS, at said election, 3,499 votes were cast in favor of formation of the district and 1,319 votes were cast against formation, and the formation of the emergency services district received the affirmative vote of the majority of the votes cast at the election as provided by law;

WHEREAS, on the 26th day of December, 2023, at a regularly called meeting of the Caldwell County Commissioners Court, the Court ordered the Caldwell County Emergency Services District formed pursuant to state law;

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court must now appoint an initial five-member board of emergency services commissioners to serve as the district's governing body, and, in order to stagger terms of office, designate three members to serve a two-year term and two members to serve a one-year term; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court has considered relevant factors in determining the individuals to appoint as emergency services commissioners, including whether the individuals have knowledge that relates to emergency medical services and that is relevant to the common policies and practices of the board.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CALDWELL COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT THAT:

(a) Subject to subsection (b) and (c) of this Order, the following persons are appointed as the initial emergency services commissioners for the Caldwell County Emergency Services District No. 5, effective immediately:







**CALDWELL COUNTY, TEXAS
DECLARATION OF LOCAL DISASTER
PROHIBITION OF OUTDOOR BURNING**

WHEREAS, Section §418.108 of the Local Government Code provides that the County Judge can declare a slate of Local Disaster within the county) and order, may prohibit outdoor burning in the unincorporated area of the county when he finds that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning and,

WHEREAS, the County Judge does find that circumstances present in all of the unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that could be exacerbated by outdoor burning;

BE IT THEREFORE ORDERED, that the following emergency regulations are hereby established for all unincorporated areas of Caldwell County, Texas that are not subject to public ownership or stewardship for the duration of the above mentioned declaration:

- I. Action Prohibited:
 - (a) A person violates this order if he/she burns a combustible material outside of an enclosure, which serves to contain all flame and/or sparks, or orders such burning by others.
 - (b) A person violates this order if he /she engages in any activity outdoors which could allow flames or sparks that could result in a fire, unless done in an enclosure designed to protect the spread of fire, or orders such activities by others.
2. Enforcement:
 - (a) Upon notification of suspected outdoor burning the fire department assigned shall respond to the scene and take immediate measures to contain or extinguish the fire.
 - (b) If requested by a fire official, a duly commissioned peace officer, when available, shall be notified and sent to the scene to investigate the nature of the fire.
 - (c) If, in the opinion of the officer investigating and the fire official, the goal of this order can be obtained by informing the responsible party about the prohibitions established by this order the officer may at his discretion notify the party about the provisions of this order and request compliance with it, or issue a citation for: **Violation of Burn Ban Order**.
3. This Order does not prohibit prescribed fire(s) conducted in compliance with guidelines set forth by federal or state natural resource agencies and conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Section 153.048 Natural Resources Code, and meets the standards of Section 153.047, Natural Resources Code, burned under a burn plan approved by such agencies, or outdoor burning activities related to public health and

safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for:

- (a) Firefighter training
- (b) Public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations
- (c) Planting or harvesting of agricultural crops

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that an exemption be hereby granted for a bona fide commercial land clearing business, allowing said business to burn as long as all other provisions of the Order and applicable laws and ordinances are adhered to as set forth herein, and contact is made and the burning approved by the Caldwell County Emergency Management Coordinator at 1403 Blackjack St. Lockhart, TX at phone Number 512-398-1822, and receiving permission, prior to any outdoor burning.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that an exemption be hereby granted to those businesses where welding is an essential function of the business, allowing welding operations to proceed as long as the area of welding operations has been cleared of vegetation for a distance of no less than ten (10) feet in all directions, that there be a second capable person acting as a fire spotter with a sufficient water source available to extinguish fires which may be ignited from stray sparks, and only when all other provisions of the Order and applicable laws and ordinances are adhered to as set forth herein.

BE IT ALSO ORDERED, that the purpose of this order is the mitigation of the hazard posed by wildfire during the term of the dry, weather by curtailing outdoor burning; which purpose is to be taken into account in any enforcement action based upon this order.

This order will remain in effect until further notice.

TEXAS INDEPENDENCE DAY FIREWORKS PERIOD

(FEBRUARY 25-MIDNIGHT, MARCH 2)

DEADLINE TO ADOPT ORDER: FEBRUARY 14, 2026

Occupations Code, §2154.202(h), permits the commissioners court to adopt an order authorizing the sale of fireworks for Texas Independence Day (March 2).

If the court decides to permit the sale of fireworks during the Texas Independence Day period, the order must be adopted before February 15. If the court does not wish to permit the sale of fireworks during this period, no action is required.

Please note the distinction between this law (Occupations Code, §2154.202(h)), which **allows** the commissioners court at its **discretion** to **permit** fireworks sales for the holiday period and the other law (Local Government Code, §352.051) which **requires** the court to take action to **restrict or prohibit** sales during certain times of the year if drought conditions are present.

To assist the court in determining whether conditions are suitable for authorizing the sale of fireworks, the Texas A&M Forest Service is required to make its services available each day during the Texas Independence Day period to respond to the request of a county as to whether or not drought conditions exist. To obtain a determination from the Texas A&M Forest Service, call (979) 458-7331.

If the court decides to adopt such an order for Texas Independence Day, it may **restrict or prohibit** the sale of "restricted fireworks," which are defined as "skyrockets with sticks" and as "missiles with fins." A violation of the order is a Class C misdemeanor. Also, a citizen may file suit for an injunction to prevent a violation or threatened violation of the order.

Under Local Government Code §352.051(f), the county may also designate one or more "safe" areas where the use of restricted fireworks is not prohibited. In determining if an area may be considered "safe" the court should take into account whether adequate public safety and fire protection services are provided to the area.

A copy of Local Government Code §352.051, and the portions of the Occupations Code that define and explain permitted and prohibited fireworks, are available online at county.org/fireworks. A sample order authorizing the sale of fireworks during this period is provided on the following page. If your court decides to designate "safe" areas, the sample order will need to be modified to include appropriate language. Purpose:

The purpose of this announcement is to solicit applications from law enforcement agencies to equip peace officers with body-worn cameras.

Available Funding:

State funds for these projects are authorized under the Texas General Appropriations Act, Article I, Rider 32 for Trusteed Programs within the Office of the Governor. All awards are subject to the availability of appropriated funds and any modifications or additional requirements that may be imposed by law. The Public Safety Office (PSO) expects to make available \$10M for FY2027.

Eligible Organizations:

Applications may be submitted by the Texas Department of Public Safety, municipalities, and counties that operate law enforcement agencies employing peace officers under Article 2.12, Texas Code of Criminal Procedure.

All applications submitted by local law enforcement agencies/offices must be submitted by a unit of government affiliated with the agency, including an authorizing resolution from that unit of government. For example, police departments must apply under their municipal government, and community supervision and corrections departments, district attorneys, and judicial districts must apply through their affiliated county government (or one of the counties, in the case of agencies that serve more than one county).

Grantees must comply with standards applicable to this fund source cited in the Texas Grant Management Standards ([TxGMS](#)), [Federal Uniform Grant Guidance](#), and all statutes, requirements, and guidelines applicable to this funding.

Eligible Activities and Costs

Funds may be used for obtaining body-worn cameras, digital video storage, and retrieval systems or cloud-based services. Subscriptions and/or leasing services that fall within the 12-month performance period are eligible.

Program-Specific Requirements

Eligible officers. Pursuant to Sec. 1701.652, Occupations Code, grant funds may only be used to equip peace officers (as defined by Article 2.12, Texas Code of Criminal Procedure) who:

1. Engage in traffic or highway patrol or otherwise regularly detain or stop motor vehicles; or
2. Primary responders who respond directly to calls for assistance from the public.

Policy. Pursuant to Sec. 1701.655, Occupations Code, a law enforcement agency that receives a grant to provide body worn cameras to its peace officers or that otherwise operates a body worn camera program shall adopt a policy for the use of body worn cameras. The policy must ensure that a body worn camera is activated only for a law enforcement purpose and must include:

1. Guidelines for when a peace officer should activate a camera or discontinue a recording currently in progress, considering the need for privacy in certain situations and at certain locations.
2. Provisions relating to data retention, including a provision requiring the retention of video for a minimum period of 90 days.
3. Provisions relating to storage of video and audio, creation of backup copies of the video and audio, maintenance of data security, and the collection of a body worn camera, including the application video and audio recorded by the camera, as evidence.
4. Guidelines for public access, through open records requests, to recordings that are public information.
5. Provisions entitling an officer to access any recording of an incident involving the officer before the officer is required to make a statement about the incident.
6. Procedures for supervisory or internal review.
7. The handling and documenting of equipment and malfunctions of equipment.
8. Consistent with the Federal Rules of Evidence and Texas Rules of Evidence.

The policy may not require a peace officer to keep a body worn camera activated for the entire period of the officer's shift.

Training. Pursuant to Sec. 1701.656, Occupations Code, a law enforcement agency must provide training to:

1. Peace officers who will wear the body worn cameras.
2. Any other personnel who will come into contact with video and audio data obtained from the use of body worn cameras.

Reporting. Pursuant to Sec. 1701.653, Occupations Code, a law enforcement agency shall annually report to the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (TCOLE) regarding the costs of implementing a body worn camera program, including all known equipment costs and costs for data storage.

Eligibility Requirements

1. Applications from nonprofit corporations, local units of governments, and other political subdivisions must submit a fully executed resolution with the application to be considered eligible for funding. The resolution must contain the following elements (see [Sample Resolution](#)):

- Authorization by your governing body for the submission of the application to the Public Safety Office (PSO) that clearly identifies the name of the project for which funding is requested;
- A commitment to provide all applicable matching funds;
- A designation of the name and/or title of an authorized official who is given the authority to apply for, accept, reject, alter, or terminate a grant;
- A designation of the name and/or title of a financial officer who is given the authority to submit financial and/or performance reports or alter a grant; and
- A written assurance that, in the event of loss or misuse of grant funds, the governing body will return all funds to PSO

2. Local units of governments must comply with the Cybersecurity Training requirements described in Section 772.012 and Section 2054.5191 of the Texas Government Code. Local governments determined to not be in compliance with the cybersecurity requirements required by Section 2054.5191 of the Texas Government Code are ineligible for OOG grant funds until the second anniversary of the date the local government is determined ineligible. Government entities must annually certify their compliance with the training requirements using the [Cybersecurity Training Certification for State and Local Governments](#). A copy of the Training Certification must be uploaded to your eGrants application. For more information or to access available training programs, visit the Texas Department of Information Resources [Statewide Cybersecurity Awareness Training](#) page.

3. Entities receiving funds from PSO must be located in a county that has an average of 90% or above on both adult and juvenile dispositions entered into the computerized criminal history database maintained by the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) as directed in the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, Chapter 66. The disposition completeness percentage is defined as the percentage of arrest charges a county reports to DPS for which a disposition has been subsequently reported and entered into the computerized criminal history system.

Counties applying for grant awards from the Office of the Governor must commit that the county will report at least 90% of convictions within five business days to the Criminal Justice Information System at the Department of Public Safety.

4. Eligible applicants operating a law enforcement agency must be current on reporting complete UCR data and the Texas specific reporting mandated by 411.042 TGC, to the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) for inclusion in the annual Crime in Texas (CIT) publication. To be considered eligible for funding, applicants must have submitted a full twelve months of accurate data to DPS for the most recent calendar year by the deadline(s) established by DPS. Due to the importance of

timely reporting, applicants are required to submit complete and accurate UCR data, as well as the Texas-mandated reporting, on a no less than monthly basis and respond promptly to requests from DPS related to the data submitted.

5. In accordance with Texas Government Code, Section 420.034, any facility or entity that collects evidence for sexual assault or other sex offenses or investigates or prosecutes a sexual assault or other sex offense for which evidence has been collected, must participate in the statewide electronic tracking system developed and implemented by the Texas Department of Public Safety. Visit [DPS's Sexual Assault Evidence Tracking Program](#) website for more information or to set up an account to begin participating. Additionally, per Section 420.042 "A law enforcement agency that receives evidence of a sexual assault or other sex offense...shall submit that evidence to a public accredited crime laboratory for analysis no later than the 30th day after the date on which that evidence was received." A law enforcement agency in possession of a significant number of Sexual Assault Evidence Kits (SAEK) where the 30-day window has passed may be considered noncompliant.

6. Local units of government, including cities, counties and other general purpose political subdivisions, as appropriate, and institutions of higher education that operate a law enforcement agency, must comply with all aspects of the programs and procedures utilized by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security ("DHS") to: (1) notify DHS of all information requested by DHS related to illegal aliens in Agency's custody; and (2) detain such illegal aliens in accordance with requests by DHS. Honorable Members of the Commissioners Court,

I respectfully submit this request seeking the Court's approval to apply for federal grant funding to support a targeted traffic safety enforcement initiative within Caldwell County Precinct 2. This request is made in direct response to ongoing traffic safety concerns raised by residents and to the continued demands placed on the Constable's Office as a result of serious vehicle crashes throughout the precinct.

Identified Public Safety Concern

Caldwell County Precinct 2 has identified persistent traffic safety concerns on several major roadways, most notably State Highway 86 (TX-86), State Highway 80 (TX-80), and other state-maintained highways within the precinct. Increased traffic volume, speeding, unsafe driving behaviors, and continued population growth have elevated the risk of serious crashes, injuries, and fatalities on these corridors.

Residents routinely express concerns regarding speeding, aggressive driving, and the frequency of serious crashes along these roadways. These highways serve as critical commuter and commercial routes, and traffic safety along them remains a consistent quality-of-life issue for citizens across the precinct.

Operational Impact on the Constable's Office

As a result of these ongoing traffic issues, the Constable's Office regularly assists other agencies in responding to major vehicle crashes throughout Precinct 2. These incidents require significant law enforcement resources for traffic control, scene security, and coordination with fire and emergency medical services.

While the Office plays an active role in crash response, the ability to prevent crashes through sustained, proactive enforcement is currently limited. Deputies must balance traffic enforcement

with civil process service, court security, and routine patrol responsibilities, reducing the ability to maintain consistent, high-visibility traffic enforcement during high-risk times and locations.

Proposed Solution

This grant opportunity provides a practical and fiscally responsible solution to the identified problem. Approval to apply would allow the Constable's Office to:

- Fund dedicated traffic safety enforcement hours focused on high-risk roadways
- Conduct proactive, visible enforcement operations aimed at crash prevention
- Acquire a patrol vehicle dedicated to traffic safety enforcement activities

These resources would allow the Office to shift from primarily reactive crash response toward proactive enforcement designed to reduce crashes before they occur, without expanding permanent staffing or increasing the local tax burden.

Funding Source and Fiscal Responsibility

The requested funding consists of federal funds authorized under 34 U.S.C. § 10152 through the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program (JAG). No matching funds are required from Caldwell County.

This provides the County with an opportunity to address a documented public safety concern using external funding while preserving local resources.

Separation from Other Grant Requests

This request is wholly separate from the grant requests submitted by Constable Precincts 3 and 4 and approved by the Commissioners Court on January 8, 2025. The proposed project applies exclusively to Precinct 2, addresses distinct roadway segments, and does not duplicate personnel, equipment, or enforcement activities funded through other grants.

Secondary Operational Benefit

While the primary purpose of this request is to improve traffic safety and respond to citizen concerns, the proposed enforcement structure also provides a secondary operational benefit. By offering compensated enforcement work within the County, the grant helps reduce deputies'

reliance on off-duty employment elsewhere. This incidental benefit supports retention and recruitment, but remains secondary to the core public safety objective.

Request for Court Approval

I respectfully request the Court's approval to pursue this grant opportunity. Approval will allow the Constable's Office to proactively respond to citizen concerns, reduce the frequency and severity of vehicle crashes, and improve roadway safety in a targeted and cost-effective manner while maintaining responsible stewardship of County resources.

Thank you for your time, consideration, and continued support of public safety initiatives in Caldwell County. I am available to answer any questions or provide additional information as needed.



Grant funds may not be used to support the unallowable costs listed in the [Guide to Grants](#) or any of the following unallowable costs:

1. Construction, renovation, or remodeling;
2. Medical services;
3. Security enhancements or equipment for non-governmental entities not engaged in criminal justice or public safety;
4. Non-law enforcement vehicles or equipment for government agencies that are for general agency use;
5. Equipment, supplies, and other direct costs associated with processing DNA evidence;
6. Activities or costs in support of Operation Border Star (agencies seeking such funding should apply under the PSO Local Border Security funding announcement);
7. Law enforcement equipment that is standard department issue (including weapons, any weapon attachments and/or accessories and less lethal weapons such as tasers, non-lethal rounds, etc.; excluding equipment used exclusively for specialized training activities);
8. Transportation, lodging, per diem or any related costs for participants, when grant funds are used to develop and conduct training for outside participants;
9. Unmanned aircraft systems (UAS), including unmanned aircraft vehicles (UAV) and/or any accompanying accessories to support UAS or UAV devices/systems;
10. Items listed on the [Byrne JAG Prohibited Expenditure Category A and B List](#);
11. Rifle-resistant body armor (NIJ Compliant Type IIIA and below is eligible); and
12. Any other prohibition imposed by federal, state or local law or regulation.

Selection Process

PSO will screen all applications to ensure that they meet the requirements included in the funding announcement.

1. For eligible local and regional projects:

- Applications will be forwarded by PSO to the appropriate regional council of governments (COG).
- The COG's criminal justice advisory committee will prioritize all eligible applications based on State priorities, identified community priorities, cost and program effectiveness.
- PSO will accept priority listings that are approved by the COG's executive committee.
- PSO will make all final funding decisions based upon eligibility, approved COG priorities, reasonableness of the project, availability of funding, and cost-effectiveness.

2. For state discretionary projects, applications will be reviewed by PSO staff members or a review group selected by the executive director. PSO will make all final funding decisions based on eligibility, reasonableness, availability of funding, and cost-effectiveness.

PSO may not fund all applications or may only award part of the amount requested. In the event that funding requests exceed available funds, PSO may revise projects to address a more limited focus.

I recommend relocating the Main Early Voting Polling Place from the Scott Annex building (1403 Blackjack St., Lockhart, Texas 78644) to another location within the same city, as the building that houses the Election Office is not designed to serve as both a full-scale public voting location and the county's primary election administration workspace simultaneously. During early voting, the Elections Office must continue processing voter registration activity, vote-by-mail, ballot accountability, equipment and supply management, and coordinate Ballot Board Meetings. Running in-person early voting out of that same space creates conflicts with space, security, accessibility, and staff workload, making the current location impractical for sustained public voting.

Recent changes to the Election Code under SB 2753 have increased early voting hours and will also require early voting locations to be used as election day voting locations, putting additional pressure on the Scott Annex building. These changes make it more important that the main early voting location be a facility that can support extended hours, higher voter volume, and clear public access, while allowing the Elections Office to remain focused on administrative and compliance responsibilities.
