



SH 130 Frontage Intersections at FM 2001 Converting to All-Way Stops

Signal patterns will change to flashing red in all directions beginning Jan. 19

MUSTANG RIDGE, TEXAS (Jan. 12, 2021) — The intersections at FM 2001 along the SH 130 frontage roads in Lockhart will convert to all-way stops beginning Jan. 19.

Traffic signals at FM 2001 will convert to flashing red in all four directions, and contractors are installing new pavement markings and signage in the area.

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) approved the changes as SH 130 Concession Company works to improve the roadway for drivers.

“These improvements are being done in close coordination with TxDOT and the City of Lockhart,” said SH 130 Concession Co. Director of Public Affairs James Lovett. “Converting these locations to all-way stops will improve safety and traffic flow in this growing part of the city. As this area of Caldwell County sees more development and population growth, we will continue to work closely with our partners at the city, county and state.”

Temporary digital message signs have been placed near the intersections since Jan. 4 to alert drivers to the upcoming changes.

SH 130 Concession Company operates and maintains Segments 5 & 6 of SH 130 from Mustang Ridge to Seguin, Texas. The 41-mile section of the toll road immediately south of Austin offers a speed limit of 85 MPH — the highest in the United States.
